

NOTICE TO VOTERS
Change of Precinct Boundary Lines
and Polling Places

Precinct No. 1

That part of Lake Forest within the Town of Deerfield, also the City of Highwood, and that part of the City of Highland Park North of the South line of Section 15 in the Town of Deerfield, will vote in the City Hall, Highwood.

Precinct No. 2

That part of the City of Highland Park East of the easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R. and East of the City of Highwood and North of the center line of Vine avenue, will

vote in the Deerfield-Shields High School.

Precinct No. 3

That part of the City of Highland Park East of the easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R. and South of the center line of Vine avenue and North of the center line of Central avenue, will vote in H. F. Kelley's at 27 N. Sheridan road.

Precinct No. 4

That part of the City of Highland Park East of the easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R. and South of the center line of Central avenue to the center line of Beech street, will vote in the N. S. Gas Co. Office, 47 S. St. Johns avenue.

Precinct No. 5

That part of the City of Highland Park East of the easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R. and South of the center line of Beech street to the County Line on the South, will vote in Store at 381 Roger Williams avenue.

Precinct No. 6

That part of Highland Park West of the easterly right-of-way of the

C. & N. W. R. R. and North of the center line of Elm Place to the center line of Green Bay road, thence South to the southeasterly corner of Sunset Park, thence West to the southwest corner of Sunset Park, thence North to the center line of Harvard court, thence westerly on the center line of Harvard court and Centerfield court to the East line of High School Athletic Field, thence South along the East line of the High School Athletic Field, thence to the southeast corner, thence west to the southwest corner of the High School Athletic Field, thence North to the center of Glenwood avenue, thence West along the center line of Glenwood avenue extended to the Deerfield Town line, thence North on the Deerfield Town line to the southwest corner of Section 15, thence East to the northeast corner of Section 22, thence North on easterly City limits of the City of Highwood to its intersection with the easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R., will vote in Vencil Muzik's Store, 506 N. Green Bay road.

Precinct No. 7

That part of Highland Park West of the easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R. and South of the center line of Elm place to the center of Green Bay road, thence South to the southeast corner of Sunset Park, thence west to the southwest corner of Sunset Park, thence North to the center line of Harvard court, thence westerly on the center line of Harvard court and Centerfield court to the East line of the High School Athletic Field, thence South to the southeast corner of the High School Athletic Field, thence West to the southwest corner of the High School Athletic Field, thence North to the center line of Glenwood avenue, thence West on the center line of Glenwood avenue extended to the Deerfield Town line, thence South on the Deerfield Town line to the center line of Deerfield road, thence north-easterly along the center line of Deerfield road to Deerfield avenue, thence on the center line of Deerfield avenue to its intersection with Walnut avenue, thence on the center line of Walnut avenue to the easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R., will vote in Brand's Store, No. 532 Central avenue.

Precinct No. 8

That part of Highland Park West of the easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R. and South of the center line of Walnut avenue, Deerfield avenue to its intersection with Deerfield road, thence southwesterly along the center line of Deerfield road to the Deerfield Town line, thence South on the Town line to the southwest corner of Section 27, thence East along the South line of Sections 27 and 26 to its intersection with the center line of Green Bay road, thence northerly on the center line of Green Bay road to its intersection with the center line of Ridgewood drive, thence easterly on the center line of Ridgewood drive and Ravinia road to the intersection with the easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R., will vote in the Lincoln Avenue School.

Precinct No. 9

That part of Highland Park West of the easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R. and south of the center line of Ravinia road and Ridgewood drive to its intersection with the center line of Green Bay road, thence south along the center line of Green Bay road to its intersection

with center line of Edgewood Road, thence West on the center line of Edgewood Road and the South line of Sections 26 and 27 to the West line of Deerfield Township, thence South along the West line of Deerfield Township to the southwest corner of Section 34, thence East along the County Line to its intersection with easterly right-of-way of the C. & N. W. R. R., will vote in Witty's Store, 475 Roger Williams avenue.

**Another Letter Comes
from Martin Victor, Jr.,
Who Is on Alaska Trip**

Here is another letter from Martin Victor, Jr., of Victor Bros., local furriers, who is in Alaska in search of fine furs for their store:

Lone Star, Alaska
February 20, 1930

Mr. Paul Udell,
Highland Park Press,
Highland Park, Illinois.
Dear Mr. Udell:

Have never experienced a worse trip in my life. The temperature dropped from 38 below zero at Nenana on the 14th and kept dropping to 74 below until yesterday when it came back to 28 below. The wind has blown furiously almost every day, filling up the trail completely. My brother has a complete account in detail of these six days on the trail so far and you may get an idea of the winter travel here.

Am living on Moose, Caribou and Mountain sheep and it sure does not taste bad at all. The natives here are all speaking their Indian tongue and few of them understand English. It seems like another world here entirely, the moose and caribou tracks are thicker than rabbit tracks in Illinois. Have seen many caribou and a few moose along the trail, too bad they are out of season to shoot.

Will stay in vicinity for about a week as there are several trappers within fifty mile radius and will visit them. My dog team is completely exhausted, their feet are all bleeding from hard travel and must rest them or they will collapse. Can rent a team here for a week and will visit the trappers around here. The trails are completely covered up, but are easily found by the blaze in the trees. In many cases I have a hard time to find them myself, but the leader dog knows a trail better than a human being. Have been told that I'll see people who have not seen any human being since last September.

It is very interesting as I meet some old prospectors and trappers, they sure ask questions about Chicago, etc. They have the idea that you need to go fully armed whenever you walk the street. Most of them have never seen an automobile, etc. and have been shut off from the world in general most of their lives.

Drinking water is obtained from the nearest creek, the best ice is chopped from about four feet from the surface as the ice above that is muddy from the swampy fall water. The ice is solid all the way to the bottom and there is quite a relief to know that you may fall in and get wet.
