### A. F. of L. Unions in County Unite in New Federation of Labor

All units under the American Federation of Labor, except two, Monday night organized a Lake County Federation of Labor that joins the group in a central society, says the Waukegan Sun.

The two orders not joining were the carpenters and the electricians and this was prevented, according to A. J. McLeod, of Mundelein, the president, because these units had failed to hold the preliminary meetings. There induction, he said, would be eventual.

The new organization does not exclude or disband the Lake County Trades and Building council. It is affiliated with it, McLeod said.

The necessity of the new organization, he pointed out, was due to the fact that the Trades council could only take in members of building unions and not musicians, barbers, bakers, etc.

Besides McLeod the other officers named were Robert Brynn, Highwood trainman, vice-president; Lyle Andrews, Libertyville painter, secretary; and David McLernon, Waukegan cement finisher and plasterer, treasurer.

Trustees named were: Frank Kennedy, Libertyville machinist; A. E. Zell, Highwood trainman; and H. King, barbers' union.

The organization is non-political.
