Under the World War Veterans' Act, evidence in support of claims for service connection for all disabilities other than nervous mental diseases, spinal meningitis, active tuberculosis, the theater in years." paralysis agitans, encephalitis and dysentery must be filed prior to April 6, 1930. This covers all cases excepting where there is a record of the disability while in the service. April 6, 1930, is also the final date for making original claims for compensation. Section 206 and 209 of the World War Veterans' Act is a provision covering this limitation.

The so-called Johnson Bill now before congress which has been sponsored by the American Legion provides for a repeal of Section 206 and 209 When this bill will be favorably acted upon by congress is problematical, and all veterans who have pending claims, or who are planing on filing a claim should be warned of the limitations for their own protection.
