Louise Smith was the oratorical contest winner at Deerfield-Shields last year. She was graduated from Lincoln school.

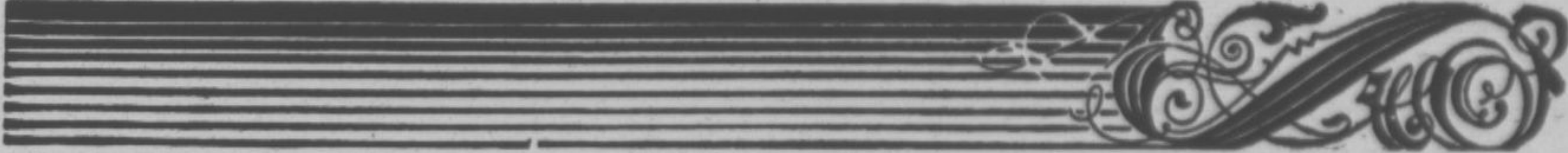
Mildred Attridge was news editor on the Shoreline staff last year.

A West London youth recently tried to be married to his sister as "proxy" for his bride-to-be, who was ill and not able to be there. The marriage was not performed.



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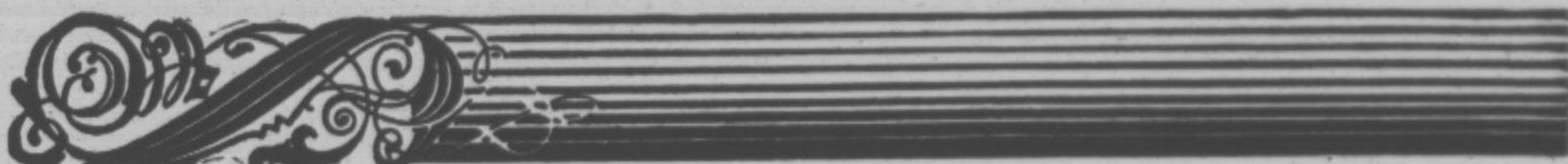
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
