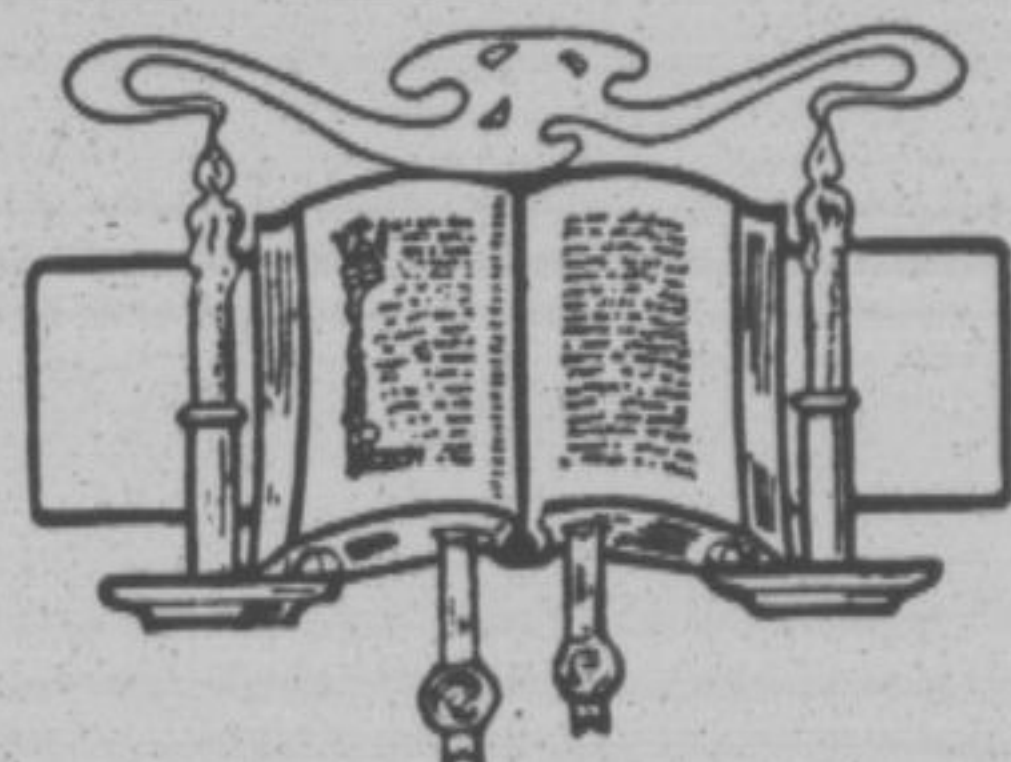


Among the Local Churches
