More than 60 army airplanes will take part in the air show which will be a part of the tournament. The tournament and exposition will be presented once each day in the evening, opening with the evening of June 21 and closing on the night of June 29.

The entire receipts from the tournament and exposition, after expenses are met, will go to the Army Relief society, an organization that assists widows and orphans of regular army soldiers.

The mean temperature for the month was 32.2 degrees or a bit above freezing on an average, and while the prevailing winds for the month drifted in from the northwest, there were 14 sunny days and 10 were only partly cloudy while 7 remained cloudy for the daylight hours. Snow covered the ground for only 9 of the 31 days of the month.


