

WAUKEGAN ELECTS NEW SUPERVISORS

Two Assistants First Time in Race Successful; Incumbents in Co. Win

In an election marked by spirited voting for favorite candidates in south side precincts and a decided apathy in the north section, Waukegan township on April 1 sent two new men in as assistant supervisors on the county board, selected Richard S. Barnum as town clerk in place of Charles E. Jack, and put Charles Druba into office as constable to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Francis Beckman who was recently appointed state inspector of weights and measures.

Charles A. Armes was re-elected assessor without opposition, carrying a total vote of 2264. George T. Spaulding was elected school trustee without opposition, polling 1555 votes while Arthur E. Radcliffe was elected school trustee to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of David A. O'Connor, who has moved his residence to Evanston.

The election in Waukegan township drew one of the smallest votes on record and had it not been for the support accorded south side candidates by their constituents, there would have been no stir at all.

Burke Leads Again

Frank Burke, veteran assistant supervisor who has always led his ticket in eight starts, again carried the lead

while A. J. Sutkus, trailing until the 20th precinct, his own, came in, boomed into second place to Burke's 1824 with a total of 1550. Ira W. Holdridge, also a veteran on the board, was third with 1520 while Walter N. Piquette, making his first run for political favor, gathered in the fourth position to be filled with a total of 1367 and defeated Charles Crapo for re-election by 20 votes in the unofficial count. George Sandstrom, with 979, and Charles O. Jones with 819, were the other "also rans."

Incumbents All Re-Elected

April 1 was a great day for the incumbents in the townships of Lake county for when the smoke of the balloting dispersed, every office holder running for re-election outside of Waukegan was victorious.

Hot contests occurred in the townships of Benton, Libertyville, Warren, Ela, Shields and Vernon, where opposition of varying strength was offered to the seated candidates.

Voliva Ticket Victorious

In Benton, a capacity vote reelected the Voliva ticket although the Independents put up a fight that almost doubled their vote over the last township election. The Independent vote was curtailed slightly by the apathy of Winthrop Harbor voters whose turnout was half of their actual strength.
