Is to Begin May 19**

The Chicago North Shore Music Festival will be held this year at the Northwestern university gymnasium, Evanston. The management announce five gala concerts beginning Monday evening, May 19 and continuing Tuesday evening, Thursday evening, Saturday afternoon and Saturday evening.

Dean Peter C. Lutkin has announced that this will be his last year as musical director of the festivals. For twenty-one years he has conducted the affairs of the festival. The festivals were organized in 1909.

Madame Schumann-Heink, soloist at the first festival given twenty-one years ago, has asked to again appear as soloist at Dean Lutkins Jubilee year. She will sing at the first concert Monday evening and again Saturday afternoon. The list of soloists is not yet complete, but those announced to date include Madame Schumann-Heink, contralto; Nanette Guilford, soprano; Alevine Resseguie, contralto; Frederic Baer, baritone; Claire Dux, soprano; Percy Grainger, pianist; Florence Macbeth, soprano; Jeannette Vreeland, soprano; Richard Crooks, tenor; Radmund Koch, baritone; Dusolina Giannini, soprano, and Richard Bonelli, baritone.

The Chicago Symphony orchestra under the direction of Frederick Stock will play at all performances. John W. Beattie will again act as associate director.
