SUBURBAN BUILDING SHOWS SLIGHT GAIN

March Record Is Increase Over February, but Much Less than March, 1929

Building construction in Chicago suburbs made a gain of 39% in March as against February this year, according to the building survey department of S. W. Straus & Co.

Forty-three suburbs did a volume of \$2,968,690 last month as against \$2,137,474 in February this year, thus indicating an upward trend.

As compared with the same month last year, however, these same suburbs took a loss of 57%.

For the first quarter of this year these suburbs did a volume of \$6,246,369 as against \$15,239,956 for the same group of suburbs during the first quarter of last year. The comparative loss was 59%.

Tillie Martin Holds L. F. College Record

With the first outdoor track meet with Beloit but one week away, the Lake Forest college thin-clads are rapidly rounding into shape. The track team will be again under the tutelage of Coach MacIntosh, director athletics at the north shore college, who has coached the team the past two years. Three men on the present track team hold five of the all time Lake Forest college track records. Tillie Martin, all-around star, formerly of Deerfield-Shields high school, holds the broad jump, high jump, and javelin records, two of which he made last year and one the year before. Capt. Guy Williams holds the college high hurdle record at 15 3-5 seconds. Carl Parker, who won fifth place in the all-around at the Illinois relays holds the college pole vault record. With these three men as a nucleus, Coach MacIntosh expects to build a well balanced team.

What Price Liberty, or, How Free Are We? Fundamentals Suffer

It has always been the pride and boast of America that it is "the home of the free." But just how free are we? With our hundreds of thousands of federal and state laws, to say nothing of city ordinances, what citizen can go through a day of 24 hours without consciously or unconsciously violating one or more of them?

Yet, "ignorance of the law excuses no man." And yet, again, not one official in a hundred is familiar with all the laws and ordinances which he is sworn to enforce.

It is true, of course, that the ever increasing complexity of our civilization—or is it civilization?—appears to make new laws necessary from time to time. But is there any justification for the orgy of law-making, with its inevitable accompaniment of law-breaking, which this country has witnessed in recent years?

The most disturbing result of all this is that really serious crimes, such as murder, burglary, arson and the like, are seldom punished, while the ordinarily decent citizen is harassed in his business and in his private life by a maze of laws and bur-

eaucratic regulations which require an army of officials to enforce. And at that they are not enforced.

It looks as though we are paying a tremendous price for government, the principal object of which appears to be the destruction of those fundamental rights for which our forefathers fought and died.
