

## COACH "DICK" HANLEY UPHOLDS ATHLETICS

"As long as athletics are successful, they will be criticized, and the more popular they are, the more criticism will there be directed against them," was the opinion Coach "Dick" Hanley of Northwestern expressed in his speech before the boys in Deerfield-Shields assembly last Friday.

Coach Hanley said that football, contrary to making a man unfit for anything further, leaves him in a better condition both physically and mentally than before participation in it, although some sports, such as track and basketball, leave one "worn out" at the close of the season.

"As long as the American boy wants athletics he is bound to have them, and he will still desire them in the future, as they are a means of breaking down the barriers of race and creed for the purpose of reaching a goal."

## BOARD OF EDUCATION MEMBERS RE-ELECTED

Mr. Frank Read and Mrs. Nellie Flinn were re-elected for a period of three years to the Deerfield-Shields board of education in the election held last Saturday.
