## PUBLIC HEARING ON ROUTE 57 ON MAY 12

### City to Get Right of Way for State Highway Through Highland Park

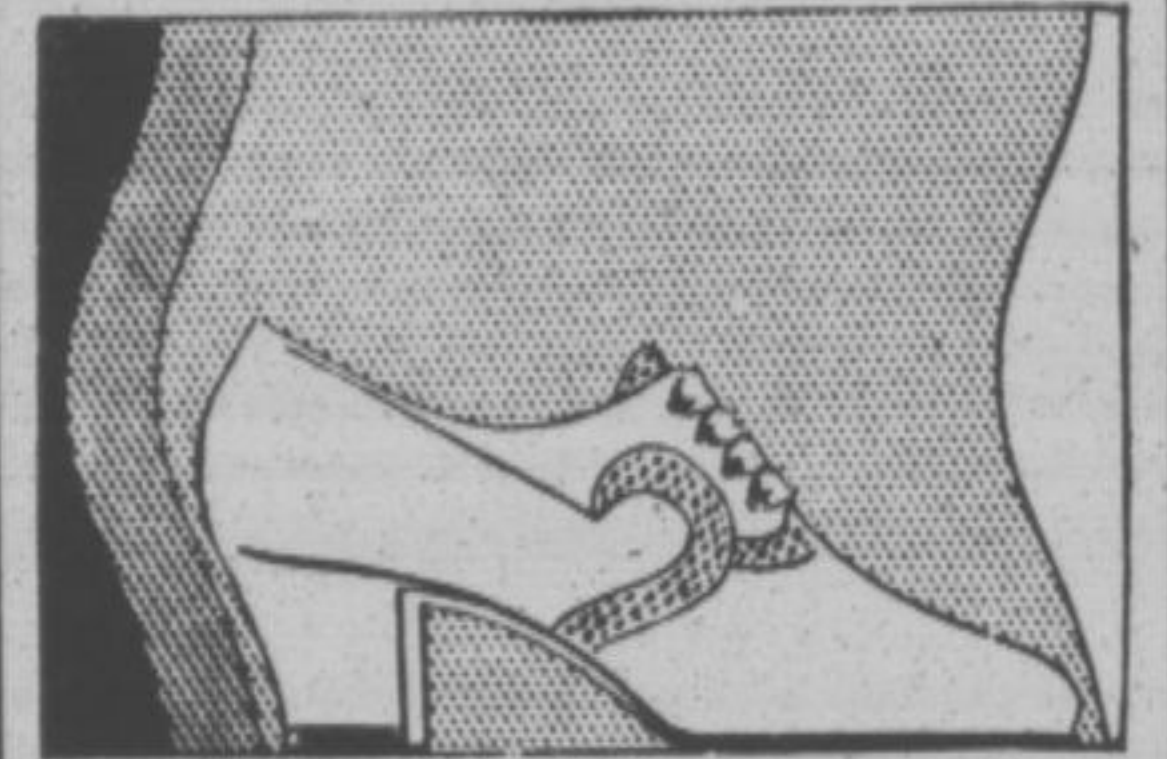
At the regular meeting of the city council and board of local improvements, held Monday evening, the resolution providing for the securing of right of way, by condemnation proceedings, through Highland Park of Route 57, the super-highway to be constructed by the state along the Skokie valley, was finally adopted, and the city council adopted the resolution employing Bowen E. Schumacher as special counsel in this matter. A public hearing on the proposed improvement is set for May 12.

#### Approve Amendment

The council approved the resolution authorizing the attorneys in the joint project of grade separation before the state commerce commission, in which several north shore cities are interested, to file an amendment to the petition before the commission.

A petition from the North Shore Riding association for a bridle path along Park avenue to connect other
