**Fox Lake Man Killed;  
Hit by One Auto and  
Thrown Before Second**Struck by one auto and his uncon-  
scious form being thrown into the  
path of another last week as he was  
crossing Grand avenue, in the village  
of Fox Lake, James Bergins, 50-year-  
old Fox Lake resident was instantly  
killed.Frank Nulk, a Fox Lake youth, who  
was driving the car that struck Ber-  
gins first, was held by Marshal J. D.  
Riggs, but was released when a cor-  
oner's jury acting under Deputy Cor-  
oner Maurice Penney, of Libertyville,  
returned a verdict stating that Ber-  
gins had come to his death from in-  
juries sustained in an unavoidable  
auto accident.According to witnesses Bergins  
started to cross the road and was hit  
by Nulk's car which was proceeding  
east in the main street of the town.  
Bergins' body was thrown to one side  
and was struck again by the car fol-  
lowing Nulk's car, which was driven  
by Frank Scharvat, a Fox Lake re-  
sort owner.Frank Ryan, 65, a bachelor who  
lived a retired existence on his 10-  
acre tract southwest of Wadsworth,  
walked out of his house at 7 o'clock  
this morning to a bench in the back  
yard and placing the stock of a shot-  
gun on the ground and the muzzle  
against his heart, pressed the trigger  
with a lath.The proposition of a city court in  
North Chicago was almost unanim-  
ously rejected at the election last  
week, the issue being defeated by a  
wide margin in every one of the three  
precincts. Only 167 votes favored the
