Poet Laureate

Robert Bridges, the poet laureate of England for 17 years, is dead. His final message, "The Testament of Beauty" only recently published, is that of a rare artist in poetry who was also among the wisest of our poets. The work is a long philosophical poem in which through an introduction and three books, Selfhood, Breed and Ethick, the poet seeks to dissolve the problem of man's discord with nature.

Johnson's Dictionary

Dr. Johnson's famous dictionary in its first edition contained the statement that "the letter H seldom, perhaps never, begins any but the first syllable." John Wilkes, wit and politician, fell afoul of this assertion in this ingenious note: "The author of this remark must be a man of quick apprehension and comprehensive genius, but I can never forgive his unhandsome behavior to the poor knight-hood, priest-hood and widow-hood, nor his in-humanity to all man-hood."

Photography

George Eastman, by Carl W. Ackerman: George Eastman originated film photography and made it a commercial success after almost incredible difficulties. He was the first American manufacturer to formulate and put into practice the policy of large-scale, low-cost production for a world market, backed by scientific research and extensive advertising.

Oklahoma

Cimarron, by Edna Ferber: The Oklahoma land rush of 1889 has long been awaiting the imaginative historian. This is primarily a story rich in events describing the development of a frontier settlement in which all types of land-hungry men had a place.

Qui Non Profecit Defecit

Hannibal, by G. P. Baker: A readable biography of the greatest general of his day. Hannibal, according to his biographer, was one of the half dozen great soldiers, whose work broke down barriers and cleared the way for larger ideas of civilization. Rome destroyed Carthage, but the influence of the Carthaginian leader remained.

The Automotive Mechanic's Handbook, by C. T. Schaefer: "A handbook on motor vehicle maintenance practice, presenting in convenient form standard practice covering tests to ascertain the condition of units and parts, adjustments, repair standards, and shop practice."—Subtitle.

Brush Country

A Vaquero of the Brush Country, by J. F. Dobie: A fine presentation of the real cowboy and his adventurous life. The book is based upon the reminiscences of John Young, an old-time cattle ranger, put into book form by an authority on this period in Texas history. The brush country was a tract of land lying between the Rio Grande and Colorado rivers in southwest Texas, and was the heart of the cattle industry.
