Lymon Wilmot Is Given Appointment

Old Deerfield residents were interested in reading of the appointment of Lyman Wilmot IV of Waukegan as a page in the House of Representatives in Washington.

The first Lyman Wilmot came to this vicinity in 1837 and settled on what is now called Wilmot road where he built a log house and later the first house north of the corner of Deerfield and Wilmot roads which is now standing.

The second house north was built by his brother Jesse Wilmot, who came in 1834.

The second Lyman Wilmot was a bachelor. The third is Lyman J. Wilmot (a son of Warren, brother of the second Lyman) clerk of the Lake County Circuit Court and the fourth Lyman is a son of Lyman J.

The average age of a page is 12 years.

The Wilmot family exercised such a strong influence on the social, religious and general community life of early Deerfield that the Wilmot school and the road which passes it are fitting memorials to the name, however a tablet stating such could fittingly be placed in the lobby of the school.

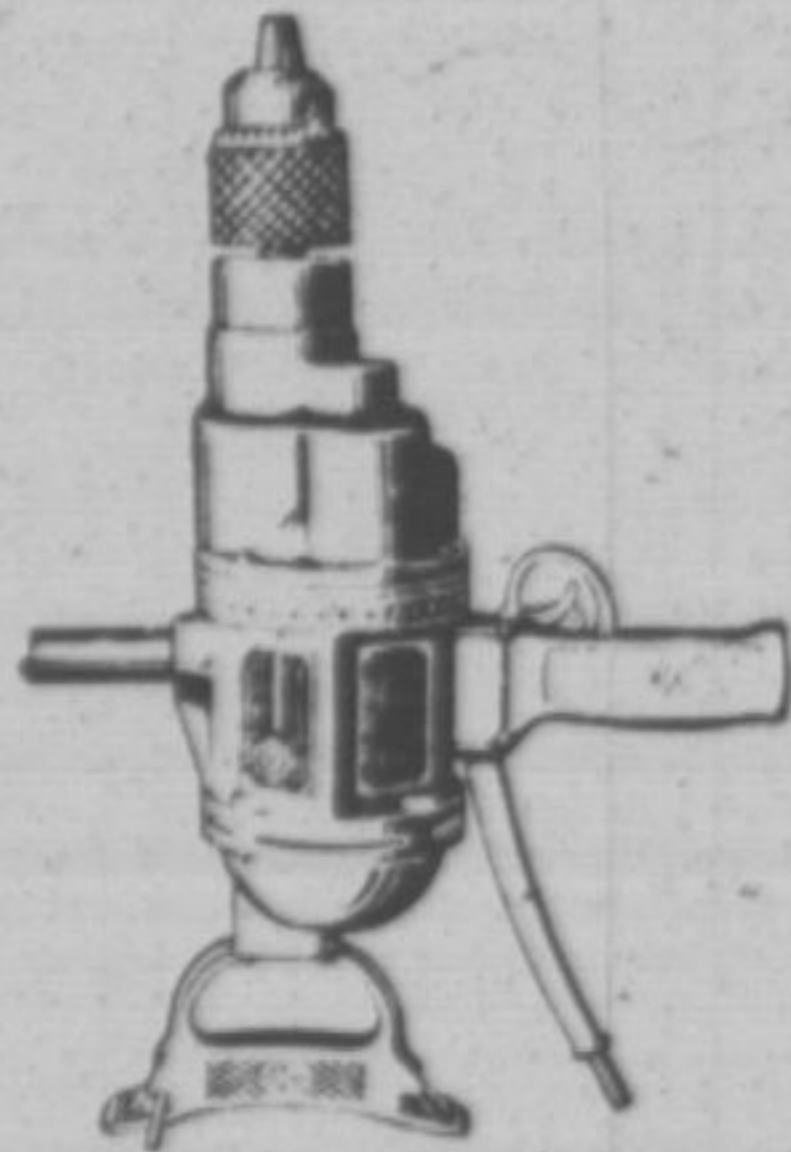
Deerfield P. T. A. Holds Rummage Sale May 9-10

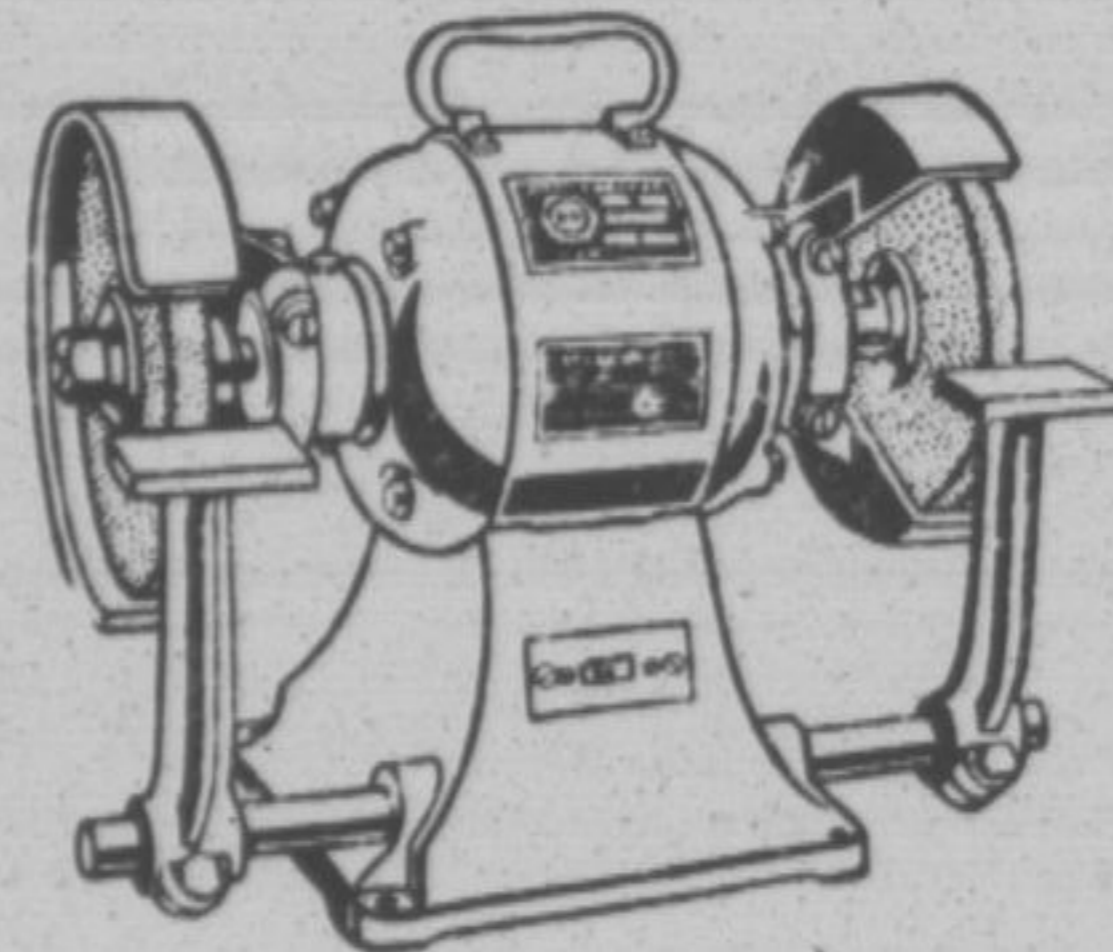
