

TEAM TAKES THIRD IN BI-WEEKLY MATCH

With the score of 483x500, the Deerfield-Shields rifle team took third place in class B of the bi-weekly matches of the National Rifle association.

The first place in this class was won with a score of 487x500 and the second place with the score of 486x500. This was the second match of

the third series, and the teams that won the first and second places will be advanced to class A because their scores are higher than are required for class B.

These bi-weekly matches are held every two weeks, the first match which a team fires determining the class that it should be placed in. In class A the teams must score between 485 and 500, class B between 450 and 485, and class C 450 or below. If

a team makes a score higher than the one required for its class, it is advanced to the next higher one.

The scoring in class A is in multiples of 30, that is, the first team gets 300 points and the second 270 and down the line. In the B class, scoring is done in multiples of 20, and in C class in multiples of 10.

There are three series throughout the year and six matches in each series, making a total of eighteen

matches. After each series the three highest teams of each class get awards, and after all three of the series have been fired, the teams with the highest score in each class get awards.

RECORDS FALL IN FAST MEET AT WAUKEGAN

Although Deerfield-Shields only won third place in the Lake County meet held at Weiss field in Waukegan last Wednesday, the boys showed some fast stepping and succeeded in scoring forty-four points in spite of the handicap of not having many field men.

Libertyville, Waukegan, Barrington, and Deerfield participated in the meet. Libertyville scored 40 points, and with the advantage of a 2 to 1 handicap against Deerfield and Waukegan, they won the meet. Waukegan scored 20 points, and Barrington won 11 points.

The finish was close, and it was declared a tie by the judges. It was one of those close instances when one wants to yell "boo." A new county record of 22.8 seconds was established in this race.

Carr and Tucker were pressed pretty hard to win first and second respectively. Daycliff of Waukegan was right behind Tucker, and he tripped at the finish, causing Tucker to spill and get a badly scraped knee.

Erickson easily won the mile for Deerfield, while Lowe took a fourth.

Libertyville took the first three places in the pole vault, thereby earning one-fourth of their total points.
