

H. P. Parents Interested in L. F. Day School Plan to Erect New Building

Highland Park parents who have children in the Lake Forest Day school in Lake Forest will be interested to know that the school is purchasing 15½ acres of ground on Green Bay road, south on Onwentsia road, and extending east to Western avenue at a site for school buildings

to be erected in time for the beginning of school in the fall of 1931. The property is being purchased from the Leander McCormick estate and a small section from Louis F. Swift on very favorable terms, it is reported, in consideration of the purpose for which it is intended. The buildings will face Green Bay road in three units, the first of which will be started this fall and will cost about \$100,000. The others will be erected as needed.

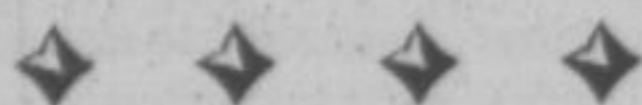
