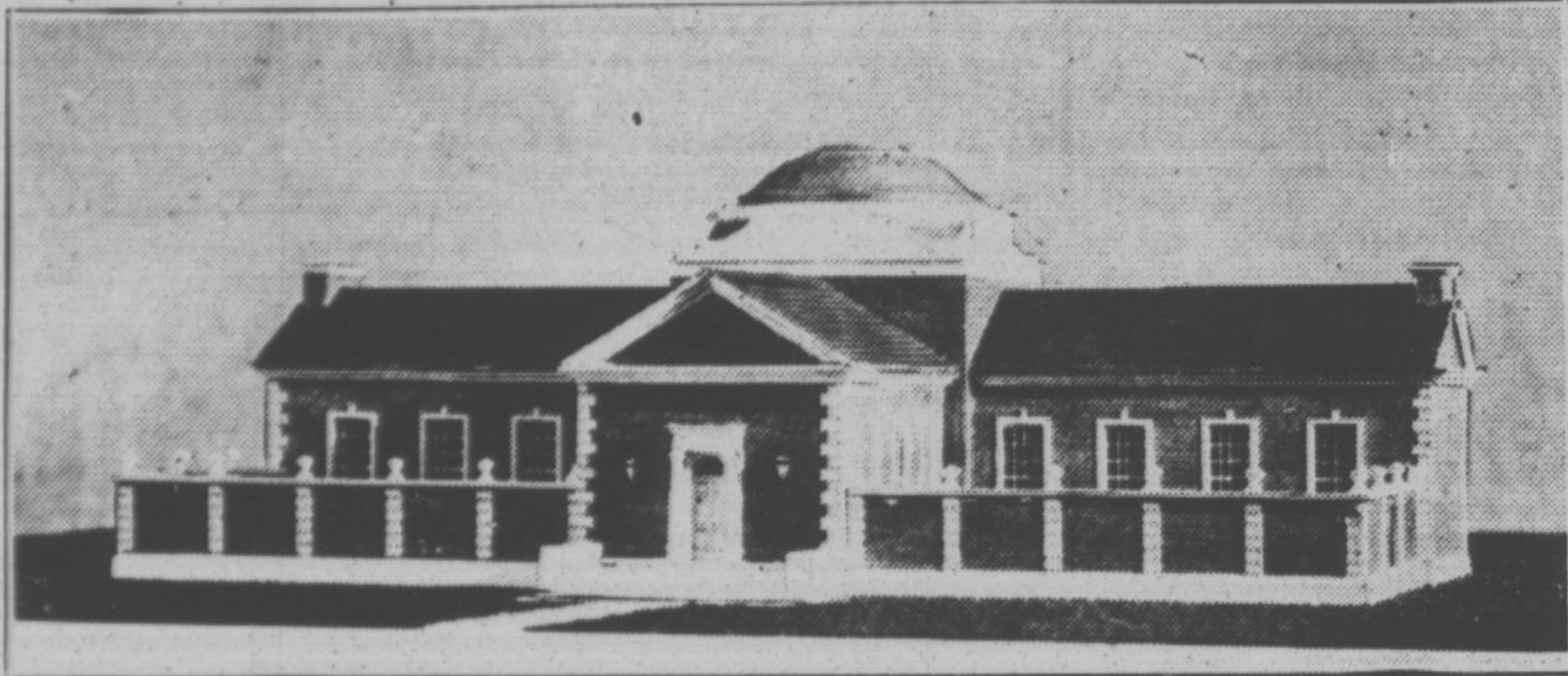


LAKE FOREST'S NEW BOOK CENTER

Clark, to be erected on Deerpath avenue, immediately east of the Lake Forest Methodist Episcopal church in that suburb. The site, which covers two acres, and the \$500,000 structure are the gift of Mrs. Reed and Mrs. Charles H. Schueppe, daughters of the late John G. Reed. Frigidaire Announces New DeLuxe Refrigerator

A de luxe electric refrigerator, with five compartments, four temperatures and two humidity ranges is announced by Frigidaire corporation. It has special storage space for bottled goods, frozen foods and ice cubes, according to the announcement.

The interior of the right side of the cabinet is designed in the conventional manner for shelf storage. The interior of the left side is reached through two extra doors which shut in the lower temperatures provided in this half of the cabinet. Two moist air compartments afford space for more than a peck of leafy vegetables. Larger ice trays are included as regular equipment.

The new refrigerator, now on display, is built in nine and twelve cubic foot models only. It is finished in porcelain-on-steel and in its exterior appearance does not differ from regular household models. It is designed to furnish the maximum service which can be rendered by an electric refrigerator, the factory announcement says.

To Landscape Cloister of Eugene Field Burial Church at Kenilworth

Landscaping of the cloister close at the Church of the Holy Comforter at Kenilworth, where Eugene Field, famous newspaperman and poet, is buried will be undertaken this spring, the Rev. Leland Hobart Danforth, rector of the parish announced recently.

The cloister close at the church has become a national shrine with hundreds of visitors from all parts of the country coming each year to view the final resting place of the great poet of children. He is best known for his "Little Boy Blue."

Four years ago, Field's remains were removed from Cleveland cemetery and permanently interred beside the Kenilworth church, where a few years ago a grandson of his sang in the choir and acted as acolyte. A memorial window, overlooking Field's grave, has been installed in honor of the grandson.

The plans for beautifying the close where Field's tomb is located call for planting new trees and re-arranging the general landscaping of the shrine. The changes will be financed through a gift from George Phillips, Jr., as a memorial to his father, George C. Phillip, Sr., the Rev. Mr. Danforth announced.

The Kenilworth Garden club will assist in the supervising of the work. Three members of the club have been appointed as a committee on the project. They are: Mrs. Douglas Flood, Mrs. Herman Brasfert, and Mrs. Charles R. Bull.
