One of the many foods which will be found convenient for our emergency shelf is crab meat, and a bottle of tabasco sauce is also an excellent seasoning to be used occasionally.

For the following recipe both of the above are used, the six and one-half ounce can of crab meat holding the amount called for. This may be baked in the glass pie pan of nine and one-half inches or in any other

flat dish in which it may be served.

### Deviled Crab

2 tablespoons butter  
1 teaspoon minced parsley  
1 teaspoon minced onion  
1½ cups top milk  
1½ cups fine bread crumbs  
1 can crab meat (6½ oz. size)  
3 hard boiled eggs cut fine  
½ teaspoon tabasco sauce  
½ teaspoon paprika  
1 teaspoon salt  
½ teaspoon dry mustard  
2 tablespoons lemon juice

Melt butter, add onion and parsley and cook two or three minutes, then pour in the milk and heat to boiling point. Add crumbs and other ingredients except lemon juice, blend thoroughly, remove from fire and add lemon juice.

Place in well-greased pan in which it is to be served, sprinkle with buttered crumbs, with a little paprika sprinkled over the top. Brown in a 450 oven for 20 to 30 minutes, this being the temperature at which we would bake baking powder biscuits. Instead of baking this in one dish,

it may be baked in the flat individual serving dishes or in scallop shells. It is quite attractive served in the scallop shells, which may be procured in most housekeeping departments.

## Preliminary Figures Show Population Tripled

## Reduction in Rates of Transatlantic Telephone

A general rate reduction of \$15 involving all transatlantic telephone conversations between North America and Europe is announced by the Illinois Bell Telephone company to take effect at midnight Saturday.

The reduction cuts the rate from Highland Park to London from \$48 to \$33 for the first three minutes; Highland Park to Paris, from \$51.75 to \$36.75; Highland Park to Berlin, from \$53.25 to \$38.26; Highland Park to Rome, from \$54 to \$39; Highland Park to Madrid, from \$54 to \$39, and Highland Park to Stockholm, from \$54.75 to \$39.75. On the basis of last year's traffic the reduction will mean a saving of approximately \$50,000 a year to the users.

Chief among the factors enabling the company to put the new reduction into effect is increased usage of the service. During 1929 transatlantic telephone conversations averaged about fifty per business day.

This service started in 1927 with one radio channel connecting New York and London. Service is now on a full twenty-four-hour basis, with four channels linking nearly all the countries of Western Europe with all telephones in the United States, Cuba and the majority of those in Canada and Mexico.

The American Telephone and Telegraph company has announced plans for a radio telephone station on the Pacific Coast to connect with telephones in Hawaii and possibly other countries. A submarine telephone cable to extend from Newfoundland to Ireland is also planned to be completed in 1932. It will supplement the present radio telephone service to Europe, furnishing additional voice and telegraph channels, which by that time will be needed to handle the expected increase in overseas traffic.
