

TRAGIC DEATH OF FORMER RESIDENT

Miss Dorothy E. Brown Dies by Own Hand at Home in Glencoe; Funeral

Friends in Highland Park were shocked and deeply grieved at the news of the sad death of Miss Dorothy Ellen Brown, 32, daughter of A. G. Brown, architect for the Pure Oil Co., and formerly a resident of Highland Park, who shot herself in the head Saturday morning in the family home at 460 Oakdale avenue, Glencoe. She was dead when found.

Miss Brown some years ago, while the family resided in Highland Park, was manager of the Y.W.C.A. cafeteria on Central avenue. Her father during his residence here was for three and one-half years a city commissioner in the administration of Mayor Samuel M. Hastings and a man well known and widely esteemed, as was the entire family while here.

Many Friends Here

Miss Brown had many warm friends in Highland Park whose sorrow at the news of her tragic death while suffering despondency, is profound. In Glencoe she had attempted to achieve financial independence by opening a dressmaking shop, known as "Brownie's Personal Service Shoppe," but because of bad collections this was not a success, and

The Board of Education, District 108, has inaugurated a budget system for its schools as part of its regular method of operation with a view of balancing its budget. Every expense for the year is catalogued under a separate head, the amount of the appropriation for each branch for operating the schools is set aside in a bookkeeping fund, and expenses are kept within the amount set apart for that purpose. The aim is to develop the greatest efficiency in the plant and the greatest value for each dollar expended, that the best procurable educators may be engaged to maintain the highest possible standard of excellence.
