Begin Paving Work on Ingleside-Volo Road

Paving of the five mile stretch of Route 59 from Volo to Ingleside began last week, and the highway will be open to traffic before August 15. R. M. Lobdell, county superintendent of highways reported late last week.

Converting this five mile stretch will mean a new direct all-paved route from Chicago into the Lake county and southern Wisconsin vacation regions, Mr. Lobdell said.

It is expected that this extension of the Rand road pavement, linking Volo with Grand avenue, will greatly relieve the over-burdened Milwaukee avenue route, one of the most congested highways in the state.

Rockford Population Is Increased, Census Shows

The city of Rockford, Ill., has increased its population 29.4 per cent since 1920, according to complete census returns given out by Associated Press recently. Rockford has a population of 89,954, an increase of 19,303 over the last census.

Waukegan, perhaps one-third the size of Rockford, is still waiting for census returns.

To Dump 5 Millions of Walled-Eyed Pike Into Large Lakes in County

Lake county fishermen who seek their pleasure on the lakes in the county and who, for the past many years have had to be content with pickerel (known as snakes in the northern waters) an occasional bass, crappies and bull heads, licked their lips with glee last week as they were informed that five millions of walled-eyed pike are to be dumped into some of the larger lakes in the county.

Henry Kern, deputy state game warden, announced today that he has completed arrangements to stock the larger lakes with walled-eyed fingerlings which, within a few seasons, will be large enough to give the angler a battle and will certainly make an attractive display on a meat platter or plank.

Raised at Lincoln Park

The wall-eyes were born and raised in the fish hatchery at Lincoln Park in Chicago and will be available for "planting" in the local lakes within two or three weeks. It will mean a considerable number of large milk cans for the transportation of the baby fishes.

The reason for stocking the wall-eyes only in the larger of the lakes in the county is that their natural habitat is along the bottom of lakes deep enough would be poor homes for the wall-eyes and they would not thrive.

Condemnation Case in in Road Improvement; Right of Way Problem

Preliminary hearings in the condemnation proceedings against four Wauconda property owners, with whom the highway department has been unable to come to terms in connection with the paving of route 176, were concluded last week before Judge Edward Shurtleff, who set the date of the trial.

The four men, who have turned down the state's offer on the use of parts of their property for the right-of-way of the new road, are V. D. Kimball, George Duberville, Merritt Clark, and Mr. Hughes, according to the Waukegan News-Sun. Their holdings are part of the property fronting a half mile stretch of 176, which cannot be completed until the matter has been settled by trial.

The road is now paved from Mundelein west to the east limits of Wauconda, and again from the Rand road in Wauconda west to Burton's bridge. As soon as the amount to be paid the four balking property owners has been settled by the jury, paving of the gap will be begun.
