Deerfield Board Has Meeting Monday Night; Proceedings in Brief

The Deerfield village board held a special session Monday evening at which several matters of importance received consideration. Trustee Ira Hele, chairman of the committee on school nurse was reported working on a plan to retain the services of the nurse by co-operation of the village, the Deerfield school district and the Wilmot school district, as the village is unable financially to finance the proposition alone. The committee is to report back later regarding this plan.

Village Attorney Decker was authorized to prepare an ordinance to be presented at the June meeting to authorize the fire department to collect the two per cent tax on fire insurance business written in the village by foreign companies' agents, according to the state law in the premises. The money to be thereby derived will be used for the purchase of equipment.

The attorney also was empowered to prepare an ordinance authorizing changes in the names of certain streets.

On advice of the police committee Chester Wolff was added to the police force as night patrolman.

The water department has borrowed a leak detector, it was reported and by this means has discovered several large leaks in the system which will help to account for the difference between the amount of water used by consumers and the amount pumped. It is believed that when this investigation is completed considerable saving in water costs will be effected.
