the D. A. R. Chapter**

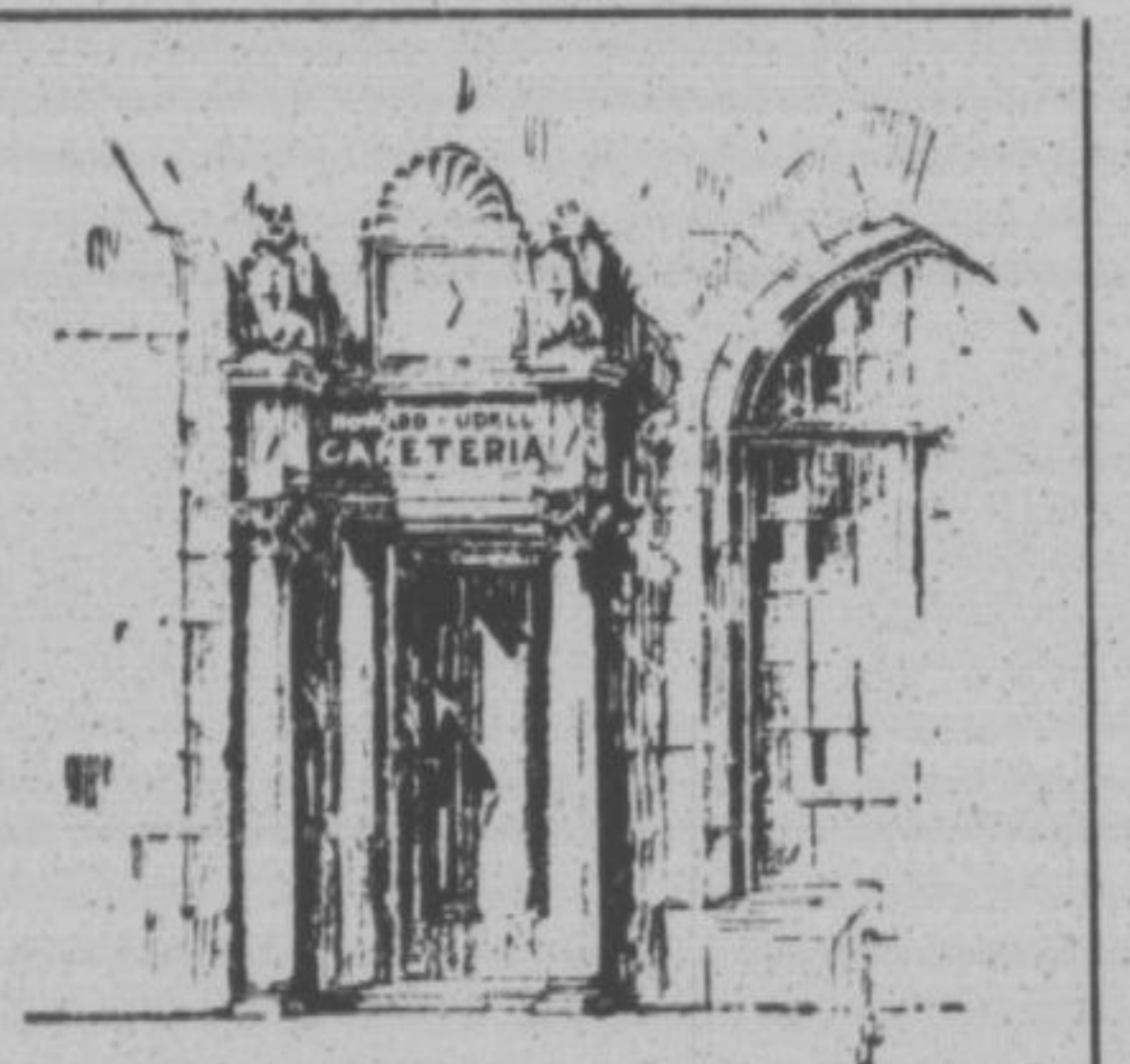
