**BUTTERWORTH WINS
CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP**

Bob Williams came in second with the score of 99x100 in the prone, and 95x100 in the sitting, or a total of 194x200. The first time Bob ever fired on the rifle team he made a score of 29x100, and now he is ending up the season with this high score, showing an improvement of over 300 per cent.
