Further Testimony in Lake Zurich Case

Further testimony in the now famous Lake Zurich injunction case was taken last week by Attorney Ralph J. Dady, master in chancery, according to Attorney George Mc-Gaughey, representing the Mrs. Margaret Pearce interests who, with August Froelich of Lake Zurich are seeking to bar cottage owners from the use of the lake because it is their private property.

Witnesses yesterday testified that they had used the lake for many years for fishing, boating and bathing, but McGaughey maintains that it was by special permission granted by the owners of the land on which the water lies.

The cuttage owners are attempting for any purpose for which you wish to show that Lake Zurich was meto use it. We have all equipment here andered by a U. S. Geological survey and is therefore a navigable body of water and open to the public of the state of Illinois.

Further hearing on the case will be held before Dady on June 2.

Widening of Highways Through County Urged

Widening of highways through Lake county to the Wisconsin state line is proposed in a plan submitted by the Chicago Motor club for the widening of 870 miles of two lane roads into four lane roads at a cost of \$53,300,000, all to be completed within the next two years.

The Lake county roads the club would widen to four lane highways youd our charge for the outfit and are: Route 19, Barrington to the Wisconsin line, 39.2 miles; Route 60, Rand Road from Arlington Heights to Wisconsin, 38.6 miles; Route 21, Milwaukee avenue, from Half Day to the Wisconsin line, 24.2 miles; and Route 68, from the junction at Lake Forest with the proposed Skokie Valley road to Wisconsin, 19 miles.

The Motor club feels that this program would aid greatly in relieving the present highway congestion and its members state that their plan has a good chance of passage in that it effects 37 legislative districts or 37 votes in the state senate.

Arson Charge Against Woman Is Dismissed

The arson charge brought by the state fire marshal's office against Mrs. Emma Nixon of Bluff Lake was dismissed by Justice Charles Mason this morning on the grounds that the evidence was insufficient to hold Mrs. Nixon.

When informed that she was again a free woman Mrs. Nixon said, "I thank God for that; not for my sake but for the sake of my children. I have never done a wrong thing in my life, and always tried to help others. When this terrible charge was brought against me it was almost more than I could bear." Her voice over the phone showed her deep emotion.

During the hearing held yesterday in the office of Justice Mason, after the defence attorney had secured a change of venue from Justice Wallenwein's court, practically all of the evidence pointed toward Mrs. Nixon's innocence of the charge. .
