SECTION V. If any such corporation, company or association shall fail to render the account or report herein designated by the day required by ordinance, or if the above mentioned rates as a tax or license fee shall remain unpaid after the day designated, towit: July 15th, every such corporation, company or association shall forfeit and pay to the said Village of Deerfield the sum of Two Hundred Dollars \$(200.00) upon conviction for each and every offense; and, in addition to such penalty, the said Village of Deerfield shall recover in an action in its name, for its use against such corporation, company or association so failing to make such report or to pay such license fee or tax, the full amount of the said license fee or tax which would be due under the provisions hereof.

SECTION VI. Any and all sums so received under the provisions hereof shall be paid over by the Treasurer of said Village of Deerfield to the treasurer of the Fire Department of said Village of Deerfield, and shall be kept by the latter as a fund, separate and apart from other funds in his hands, and shall be used for the maintenance, use and benefit of the Fire Department of the
