**AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING SUCH SUM OR SUMS OF MONEY AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO DEFRAY THE NECESSARY AND CURRENT EXPENSES OF THE VILLAGE OF DEERFIELD, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING THE FIRST DAY OF MAY, A.D. 1930, AND ENDING ON THE THIRTIETH DAY OF APRIL, A.D. 1931.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF DEERFIELD, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That the following sums, or so much thereof as may be authorized by law, be and the same are hereby appropriated for the objects and purposes herein specified to defray the necessary and current expenses of the Village of Deerfield, Lake County, Illinois, for the fiscal year beginning the 1st day of May, A.D. 1930, and ending on the 30th day of April, A.D. 1931.

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION OF A TWO PER CENT. INSURANCE TAX FROM FIRE INSURANCE COMPANIES DOING BUSINESS IN THE VILLAGE OF DEERFIELD, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS PROVIDED BY STATUTE, AND PROVIDING FOR THE RENDERING OF ACCOUNTS BY AGENTS, THE PAYMENT OF SUCH TAX, THE PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO MAKE REPORT BY SUCH COMPANIES AND AGENTS, AND THE PAYMENT OF SAID MONEY TO THE TREASURER OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT, IN THE VILLAGE OF DEERFIELD, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF DEERFIELD, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION I. That all corporations, companies and associations not incorporated under the laws of this State and which are engaged in the Village of Deerfield, Lake County, Illinois, in effecting or soliciting fire insurance shall pay to the Village Treasurer of the Village of Deerfield upon the 15th day of July of each and every year a sum equal to two (2%) per cent. of the gross receipts of pre-

miums received by such corporation, company or association or their agency or agents for business effected or transacted for fire insurance with the said Village of Deerfield, for the year ending July 1st preceding said dates. The sum above named shall be a tax or license fee upon all such corporations, companies or associations transacting such business within the said Village of Deerfield.

SECTION II. Every person acting as agent or otherwise for or upon behalf of such corporation, company or association, shall on or before the 15th day of July of each and every year render to the Village Clerk of the said Village of Deerfield a full, true and just account, verified by oath, of all the premiums which during the year ending on the 1st day of July of each and every year shall have been received by him or any other person for him in behalf of such corporation, company or association, and shall fully and specifically set out in said report the amount or amounts received as premiums for fire insurance.

SECTION III. The said agent or agents shall also at the time of the making of the above mentioned report pay to the Village Treasurer two per cent. (2%) upon the gross receipts of said corporation, company or association obtained as premiums for effecting fire insurance in the said Village of Deerfield, as specified aforesaid.

SECTION IV. If such account be not rendered on or before the day herein designated for that purpose, or if the above mentioned rates for the said tax or license fee shall remain unpaid after that day, it shall be unlawful for any such corporation, company or association to transact any business of fire insurance in the said Village of Deerfield until the requirements hereof have been fully complied with; nevertheless, this provision shall in no way effect the validity of any risk that may be taken in violation thereof between such corporation, company or association and the person so insured.

SECTION V. If any such corporation, company or association shall fail to render the account or report herein designated by the day required by ordinance, or if the above mentioned rates as a tax or license fee shall remain unpaid after the day designated, to-wit: July 15th, every such corporation, company or association shall forfeit and pay to the said Village of Deerfield the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) upon conviction for each and every offense; and, in addition to such penalty, the said Village of Deerfield shall recover in an action in its name, for its use against such corporation, company or association so failing to make such report or to pay such license fee or tax, the full amount of the said license fee or tax which would be due under the provisions hereof.

SECTION VI. Any and all sums so received under the provisions hereof shall be paid over by the Treasurer of said Village of Deerfield to the treasurer of the Fire Department of said Village of Deerfield, and shall be kept by the latter as a fund, separate and apart from other funds in his hands, and shall be used for the maintenance, use and benefit of the Fire Department of the said Village of Deerfield.

SECTION VII. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances heretofore passed and conflicting herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION VIII. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and approval. Passed and approved this 2nd day of June, A.D. 1930.
