**Bennett and Harris**  
in "Solid South";  
for Summer Season

Richard Bennett, the most outstanding star of the spoken stage today, is launched on another successful summer run in Chicago. His new comedy, "Solid South," at the Harris theatre, is one of general appeal to all classes and has the distinction of being clean as well as entertaining, truly a play for the entire family. Mr. Bennett is supported by a brilliant cast of Broadway celebrities. It was directed by Rouben Mamoulian, the genius responsible for staging "Porgy," "Marco's Millions" and "Wings Over Europe." He has brought to the stage all the glamorous romance of the South and instilled in the players an uncanny appreciation of the Southern temperament.

Mr. Bennett plays the part of a Southern major of the old school who lives in the reflected grandeur of his Confederate ancestors, and who looks upon each passing incident as a damnable plot of the Yankees to disrupt and betray his beloved Southland. In his dilapidated mansion he rules his women-folk with an iron hand until the entrance of a Pittsburgh millionaire and his Yankee son shows him up as nothing but a loud shouting old bluff whose bark is much worse than his bite.

The play is strong in its romantic appeal to women, while men delight in the rough and ready characterization of the star.

Alexander McKaig, the producer, has spared no expense in mounting the star's vehicle and the splendid cast includes Jessie Royce Dandis, Arthur Hohl, Elizabeth Patterson, Owen Davis, Jr., Mary Thayer, George Harvey, Lew Payton and Richard Huey.

**Waukegan Legion Is**  
Planning Building

Several architects' sketches of proposed designs for the new American Legion home which the Dahringer post of Waukegan is at present planning were examined and discussed at a meeting of the building committee last week. No decision as to the type which will be chosen was made, according to Victor O. Woertz, chairman of the committee.

**Condemn Part of Wall**  
New Waukegan School

A committee of three local bricklayers, meeting last week at the new addition to the North school on Franklin street, Waukegan, with the school board and the city building commission, secured the condemnation of 63 feet of brick wall in the new construction, which they charged was put up in violation of the building code. The wall was built to a height of 5 feet.

The sub-contractor, a Chicago man was ordered to tear down and rebuild the wall and to make certain other minor corrections. It was found that no headers had been used in building the wall. About \$300 is involved in the condemned work.

The school board appointed August C. Jahnke, Waukegan bricklayer and contractor, to take charge of inspecting the masonry work on the new addition from now on. The bricklayer's committee was made up of John Otis, Walter Murk and Al Matsen. The city was represented by Walter Nibbelink, building commissioner. Architect Leonard Latz was also present.
