

High School Annual Being Distributed; Is Fine Achievement

The Deerfield of 1930, the annual of the senior class of Deerfield-Shields high school, has been distributed to the students. This year's book is dedicated to Miss Zoe Comer, dramatic director of the high school who is leaving at the end of the present term.

The cover, gray with an undertone of rose, carries the dramatic symbol of masks and this theme is carried throughout the book by plates, in rose and gray, executed with high artistic achievement by Nicholas Trigo, a member of the 1930 class.
