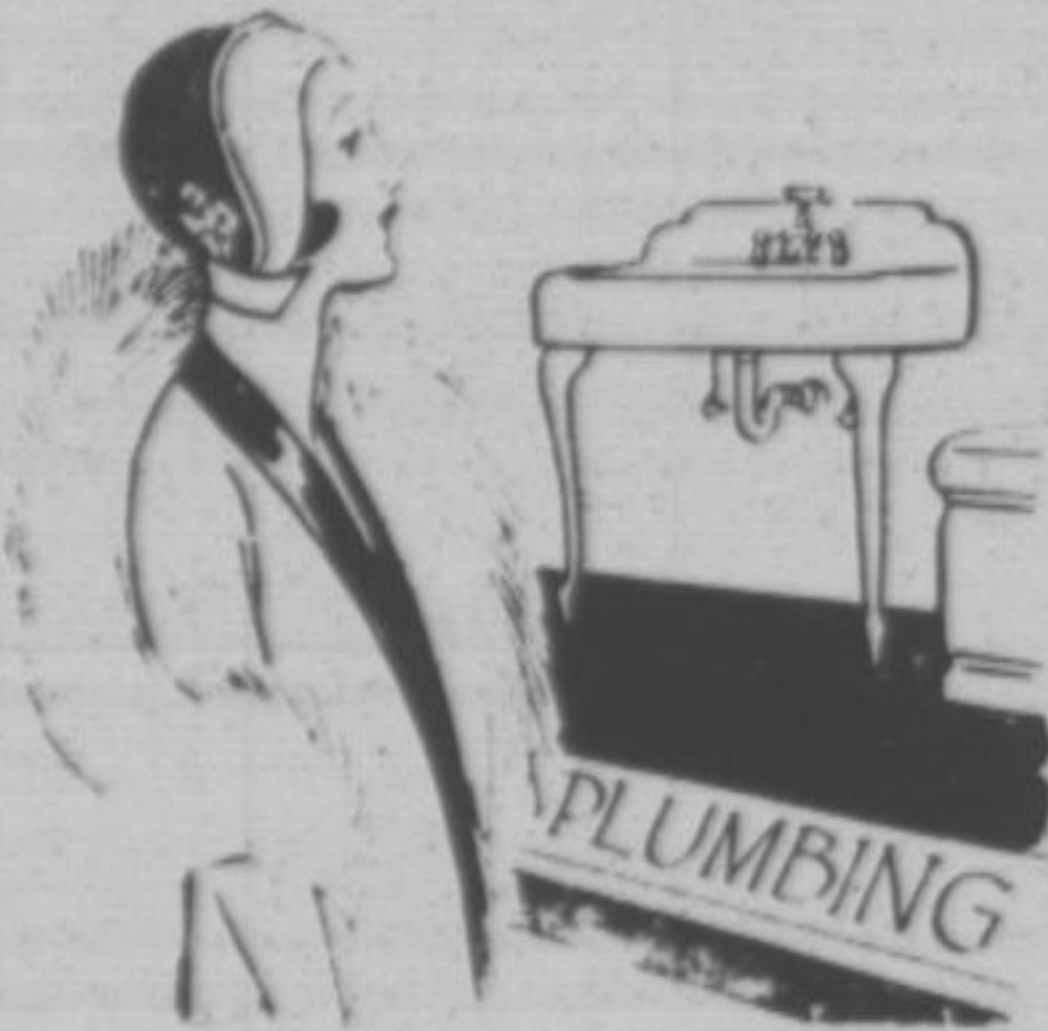

ILLINOIS BLUE BOOK FEATURES ARE MANY

Latest Annual Published by the
State Contains Much Inter-
esting Matter

A history of higher education in Illinois a 100 years ago and historical sketches of the three oldest colleges in the state are features of the 1929-30 Illinois State Blue Book, copies of which are being distributed by Secretary of State William J. Stratton. A number of other interesting articles on Illinois are included in the current issue of the book, which is more elaborately illustrated than any previous volume.

The history of pioneer education was written by Dr. Arthur Frederick Ewert of Illinois College at Jacksonville and he also writes a centennial sketch of that institution. Brief histories of McKendree college, Lebanon, and Shurtleff college, Alton, both of which also have passed the century mark, are contributed by Dr. William C. Walton of McKendree and Dr. George Milton Potter of Shurtleff.

Dr. Ewert tells of the development of the school system and the chartering of the early colleges.

Early Life of Douglas

Another interesting feature of the book is the article on Stephen A. Douglas's life in Scott county, where he passed the early years of his career and laid the foundation for his future greatness. This article was contributed by Mrs. Mary C. McAdams of Quincy, state representative from the 36th Senatorial District.

The remodeling and re-arranging of the Lincoln Tomb under plans prepared by the state architect is described in detail.

Other articles describe the progress in highway construction and the gasoline tax; bovine tuberculosis eradication in the state; the public health program as directed by the state health department; Illinois State Parks and Memorials; the housing work being done by the Department of Public Welfare for the improvement of the state institutions; the work of the Division of Forestry; the state library; the scientific surveys of water, natural history and geology and the National Guard and Naval Militia.

Voluminous statistics are provided on everything relative to the state government and also on many things not relating directly to the governments.

There is a great deal of information on the counties of the state and extensive statistics are given on the schools, universities and colleges, births and deaths and state institutions.

The book comprises 1,100 pages and is elaborately indexed and cross-indexed.

This is the first Blue Book issued by Secretary of State Stratton and it is generally conceded to be the most elaborate and complete edition ever issued by this office.
