Castle modernizing is rapidly becoming one of the chief activities of the American plumbing manufacturer. If business slows up in the United States, he sends a cablegram to his Paris representative to hunt up castle prospects. And if the wner of the French chateaux or the Italian villa is temporarily financially embarrassed, he can buy his plumbng on time payments.

Naturally the owner of a castle buys only the most expensive kind of plumbing fixtures-marble lavatories and porcelain tubs with gold plated fittings.


