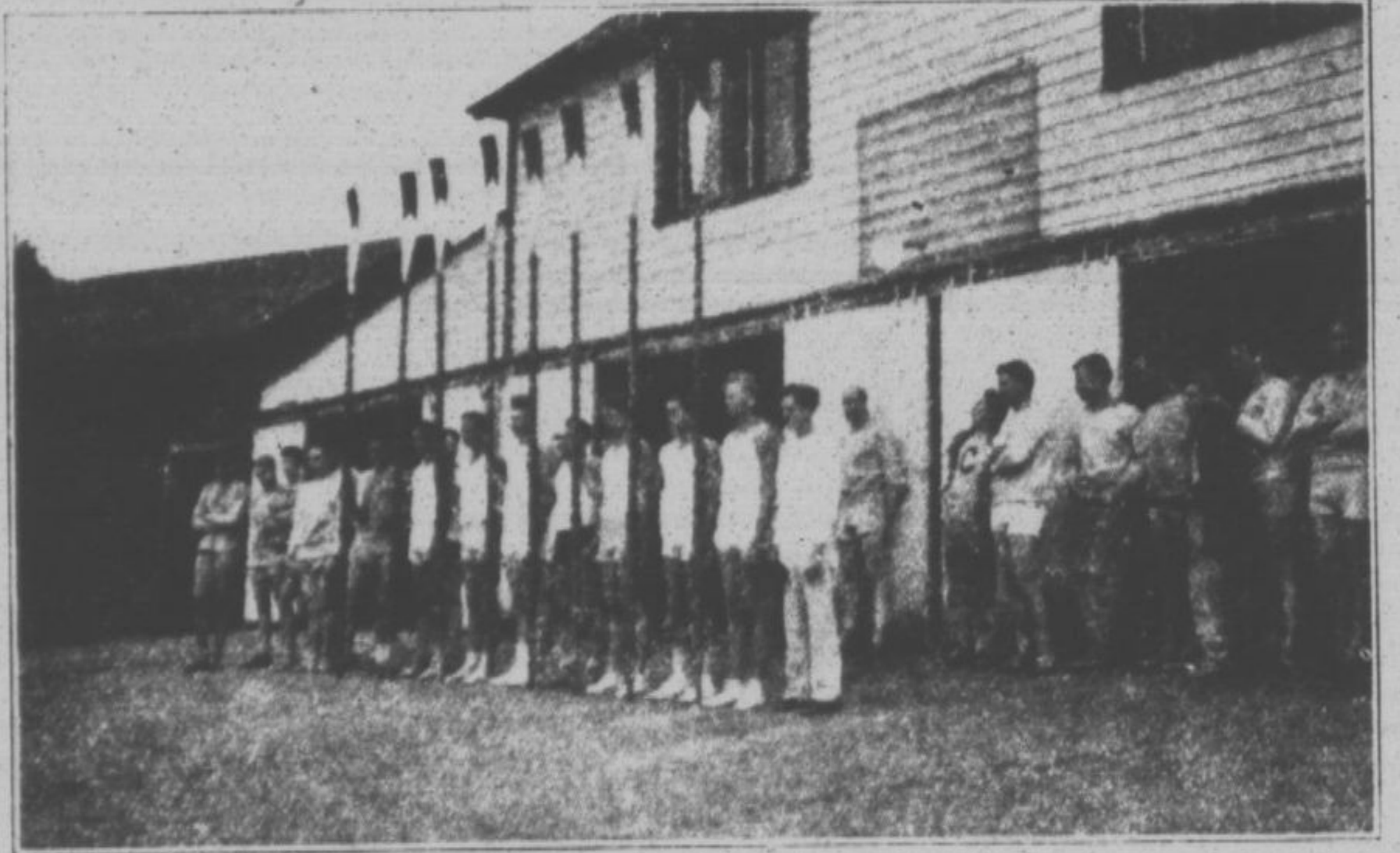

On Eve of Race

This picture, taken on May 29, before the invitation mile race between the Asheville crew and the first and second Cornell Varsity and the first Cornell freshman 150 pound crews, was won by the Asheville crew by inches in a driving finish in the fast time of 5 minutes and 24½ seconds. John M. Van Schaick, son of Mrs. Gerard Van Schaick of Vine avenue, was present at the race as first substitute of the Asheville crew.

Mr. and Mrs. Manning met the crew and the Asheville coach, Mr. A. A. Caffey, at Ithaca, N. Y. and had the privilege of witnessing this thrilling race from the Cornell launch as guests of Coach Wray of the Cornell Navy.

Row at Philadelphia

On Saturday, May 31st they also saw the Asheville boys row on the Schuylkill river at Philadelphia, Pa. in the National Interscholastic championship in the American Henley regatta.

In this race the Asheville crew was pitted against five of the strongest school boy crews of the East, and Asheville while drawing the slowest of the six courses, and having to row the first half mile over dead water while the other five crews had the

benefit of a strong current, gave a splendid account of themselves. Off to a poor start in their first big competitive race, they outrowed three of the crews and finished in third place, one quarter of a length behind the second crew and a length and a half behind the winners.

Give Dinner

After the race Mr. and Mrs. Manning gave a dinner to the coach and the Asheville crew at the Bellerns Stratford hotel in Philadelphia before the crew returned to Asheville.

The Asheville crew speak in the highest terms of the hospitality of Cornell university, which left nothing undone to provide for their comfort, and the University of Pennsylvania which extended to them every courtesy extended to them during the Interscholastic regatta at Philadelphia.
