

D. A. R. Better Film Committee Report on Current Pictures

The following pictures have been reviewed by the Reviewing committee of the D. A. R. Hollywood, Calif., through the courtesy of the Motion Picture Producers and Distributors of America.

"Young Eagles," Paramount feature picture—Cast includes Charles Rogers, Jean Arthur, Paul Lukas, Stuart Edwin. A spy story about young American and German aces, which reveals secret service methods. The unique plot concerns true love, loyal friendships, with a surprising climax. This picture is interwoven with remarkable photographic effects, and will provide splendid entertainment for all.

"Lord Byron of Broadway," M.G.M.—Features Charles Kaley as a singer whose character has deteriorated, but who is recreated by a woman's love. Usual type of musical entertainment suitable for the average family, but not recommended for children.

"Ladies of Leisure"—Unusual picture technically, finely acted (notably by Barbara Stanwyck). A beautifully developed story of a very sincere and human struggle to leave her past when true love comes gives her an opportunity for intelligent acting which is combined with beautiful photography. This is a picture for adults only, and discriminating adults will love it.

"Benson Murder Case"—Detective mystery story above the average, featuring Dr. Powell as Philo Vance. The initial situation is well built up and plenty of suspense well managed. Clever acting on part of entire cast makes absorbing entertainment which may be rather thrilling and mature for sensitive children, but otherwise is harmless and not too violent.

Legion Pilgrimage to Orphans' Home at Normal, Sunday, June 22

The individual pilgrimage of the Lake county council of the American Legion by auto to the Soldiers Orphans home at Normal, Illinois, has been merged with the Annual Department Pilgrimage, and will take place Sunday, June 22.

It is most desired that a large delegation from every post in Lake county, join in this pilgrimage to do honor to the children of departed and disabled comrades, and in order that Lake county may retain its own identity, both to and at Normal, the following schedule and instructions are submitted for the guidance of all posts which will enable the district to tell the world that we are keeping faith with departed comrades in this great job of child welfare:

1. Pack a big basket of lunch, large enough to entertain one or two of the little tots at Normal as they have never been entertained in the past. Ice cream, pop, etc., will be provided at Normal.

2. All cars making pilgrimage from Lake county, will assemble facing east on Deerfield avenue, head of column at Waukegan road, in Deerfield, Illinois on Sunday morning, June 22 and will start promptly at 8 a. m. An effort is being made to secure a police escort all the way to Normal.

Route to be taken: Waukegan road No. 42 to Touhy avenue, Touhy avenue to Des Plaines, Route 46 at Des Plaines to Route No. 4 to Normal.

3. Each car should be decorated by owner with red, white and blue bunting, which will give identity to the movement.

4. Wear Legion caps.

5. Each post should provide a contribution, same to be pooled and presented at Normal to provide new uniforms for the Boys' Band, which are badly needed. Such contributions should be made and presented at the next meeting of the Lake county council at Lake Bluff on June 20.

Not less than 1000 cars from Lake county should take part in this pilgrimage, which in reality will be a parade all the way to Normal.
