gas. He pressed it and quickly dropped to the floor behind the marble counter. The robber, surprised by the quick rush of tear gas which filled the outer room, fired at Benson, the bullet passing just above the clerk's body, and lodging in the wall behind him. Had Benson not dropped quickly, he would have been struck by the bullet.

Flees in Auto

Shocked by the sting of the gas, and with tears streaming from his eyes, the bandit quickly turned, staggered to the automobile parked just outside and drove south.

He was badly affected by the gas, eye witnesses told Chief Henderson, and was driving like a drunken man. The car was wobbling from one side of the street to the other as it gathered speed, they said.

Ernest Muzzetti and Orlando Berti, clerks, were in the bank and were also affected.
