women serve on juries. In Illinois the question will be decided by referendum at the November election.

Insures Good Juries

Says Judge Allen, "Women on juries double our chances of getting good juries. Educated women have more leisure, unless they have young children, then business men, and therefore we find them less apt to evade jury duty than men of the same class. That means in calling women to serve as jurors that new sources of intelligence are opened up, and intelligence is surely needed on a jury. That this is so in fact is demonstrated in Ohio. The women on the jury follow the evidence well and are unusually conscientious in their verdict. 'They will never play cards or throw dice to decide their vote,' is the general opinion based upon their service.

Not Sentimental

"The women are not particularly sentimental. In a first degree murder case tried in my room the women voted with the men in imposing the death penalty. Neither are they heartless. They have in a number of cases recommended mercy. For my part, I believe that in the future we shall owe much to the woman juror because of her respect for law and her conscientious demand that society be protected, and the rules of civilized conduct upheld. For my own part, I believe that the participation of women in the courts alone, not only as attorneys, prosecutors and judges, but as jury women, has immeasurably raised the tone of the administration of justice. This is particularly marked in the criminal courts, and in my opinion if no other results had come out of the enfranchisement of women but that of their participation of the work of the courts the extending of the vote to us would be amply justified."
