Motor Tourists Spend 26 Per Cent Expenses for Merchandise, Claim

Motor tourists spend more than one-fourth, or 26 per cent, of their travel budget for merchandise; 20.5 per cent in restaurants and cafes; 17.3 per cent for hotel facilities, and only 11.5 per cent for gasoline, oil and other commodities pertaining to automobiles, according to the Chicago Motor club.

The club based its statement on exhaustive research made by the American Automobile association. The remainder of the tourist's dollar is expended as follows: 10.3 per cent, transportation (railroads, street railways, taxicabs and buses); 8.5 per cent, theatres and amusements, and 5.9 per cent, confectioneries and incidentals.

It is estimated that American tourists will spend four billions of dollars this season; three-fourths of that sum will be spent in this country, while the remaining billion will be expended in Canada, Mexico, and abroad.

Motor Club Is Urging Summer Driving Care

Extra care in driving during the summer is urged by the Chicago Motor club because of the fact that children of the public, parochial and elementary schools begin their summer vacation during this and next week.

Although virtually all of the children received, as part of their school studies, instruction in street and highway safety, the motor club pointed out that in the excitement of release from school many of the youngsters will temporarily forget their safety lessons and play in the streets.

"Even the child on the sidewalk calls for added caution on the part of the motorist," the club declared in a statement. "The youngster may suddenly run into the street for some reason. This applies particularly when there is a group of children near the curb."

Falls Down Stairs; Dies of Broken Neck

Michael McVary, 55, of Mundelein, who suffered a broken neck in a fall in Mundelein early last week died, two days later at the Lake county hospital where he had been in an unconscious condition ever since the accident. McVary had gone to Mundelein expecting to go to work on an excavation job. As he was getting ready for work he stumbled and fell down the stairs and sustained fatal injuries.
