Arrest Youth in Zion For Smoking; May Fight

The Zion anti-cigaret law, which was held invalid by the supreme court 16 years ago, will be again tested before that body of Francis Hurst, 19, to be tried Friday on charges of smoking a cigarette, is convicted.

"I'll carry the fight to the highest court in the land," said Lloyd Cunningham, father of Hurst's chum, and who posted a \$400 cash bond following the youth's arrest yesterday, after Hurst had spent two hours in jail.

Hurst was standing on the platform at the Salem boulevard station of the North Shore line, waiting for a train. Pulling a package of cigarettes from his pocket, he lit one and took several puffs.

Policeman G. T. Miller tapped him on the sleeve. "That's against the law," he said. "You're under arrest."

Hurst was taken to the police station, and was allowed to call Cunningham, who produced bail for him.




