**P. J. Ramsey Appointed
State Area Manager

Paul J. Ramsey has been appointed general manager, state area, Illinois Bell Telephone company, according to an announcement made June 25. The state area includes all the company's territory except the city of Chicago. Mr. Ramsey succeeded William O. Kurtz, who on the same day was appointed general manager for the Chicago area.

Mr. Ramsey is a veteran of twenty-seven years in the telephone service, spent mostly in the plant organization. Starting in 1903 as a station installer's helper in Los Angeles, he was assigned to several different companies and repeatedly promoted until in March, 1928, he was made general plant manager for the Chicago area, where his work has been conspicuously successful. Mr. Ramsey was a major during the World war and served as signal corps representative on the Armistice commission.

They will offer certain advantages in child training and development that it will be impossible to duplicate in the private schools.
