Illinois Dean Says Cows Gave Him Start, But Doesn't Like 'Em

"Whenever I see a cow, I can always say, 'Well, what I am you helped me to be, but I never want to see you any more!'"

Thomas Arkle Clark, veteran dean at the University of Illinois made this admission before 325 4-H club members at their annual banquet in Champaign recently.

"I never did like to milk cows," the dean said, "but nevertheless I milked them regularly from the time I was seven, despite wind or rain or storm. No matter how far down in the woods the cows went during the day, it was a job at night to go down after them. And from this regular routine round of work, I learned many principles which stayed with me."

Knew Three Qualities

Dean Clark told the farm youths that there are three things that will help them get on in the world, namely: willingness to work, training to do things regularly and self reliance, a mark of well developed character.

"The thing always impressed on me," he said, "was the necessity of work. This spring some 20 per cent of our students have failed in whole or in part the things they set out in February to do.

"These boys and girls will not work, they will not do anything else. They cannot see the necessity of doing things they don't like."

Occupying the highest pinnacle in the movie world below stardom, she tells, in the American magazine, of the great wall between stage-struck girls and success — a wall that has grimly withstood the attacks of beauty prize winners, school prodigies and unscrupulous girls backed by wealthy "angels." The girl is Jane Arden and she is eminently satisfied with having reached the top of the huge list of "extras" in Hollywood.

In Hollywood there are registered at a central casting bureau 17,542 persons who are listed as applicants for "extra" jobs. No more can applicants go directly to studios. They are too troublesome and all extras are hired through the casting bureau. Hundreds of others are not even listed.

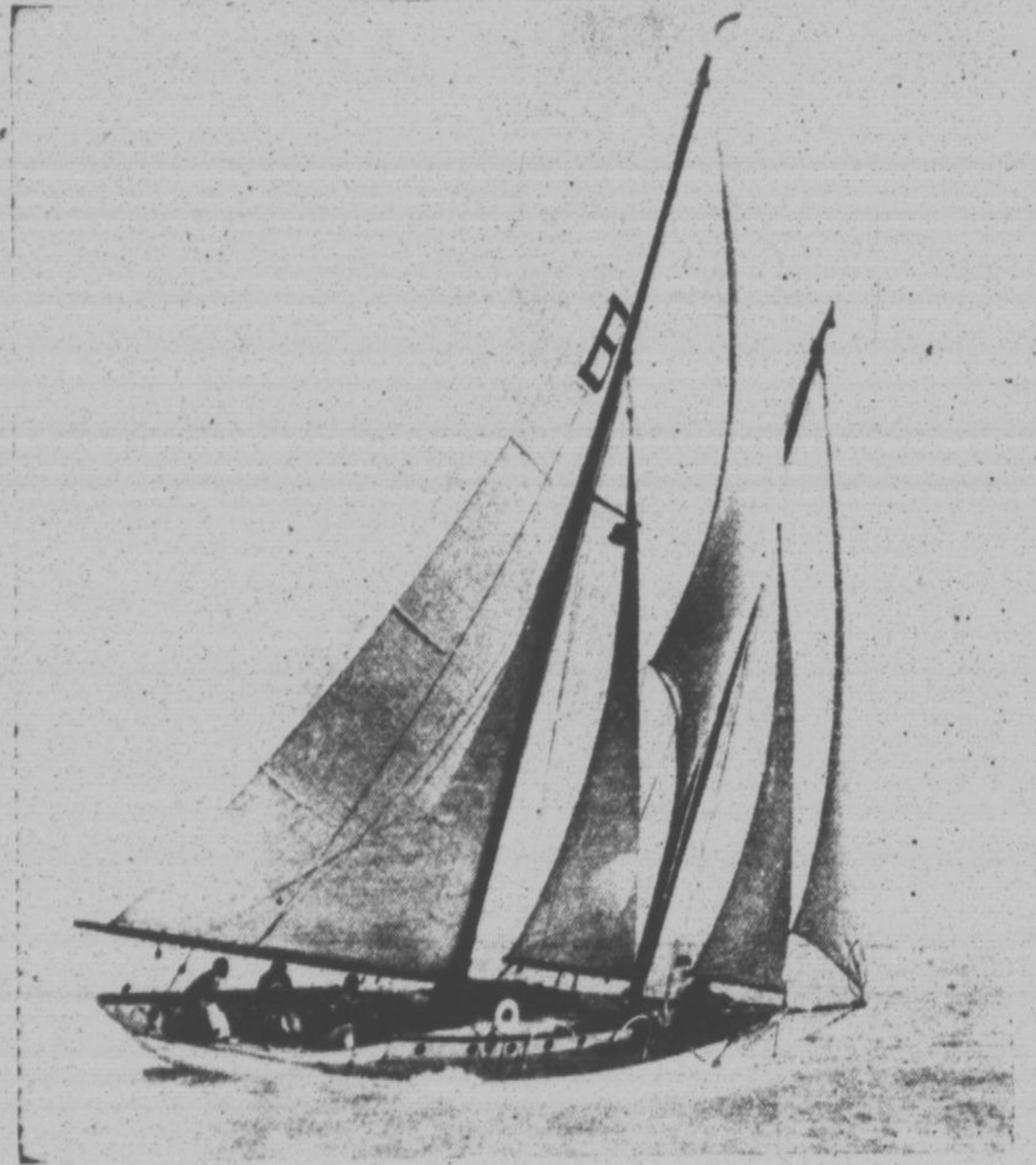
Of the 17,541 extras registered, Miss Arden is most often employed, only to appear in ensembles. She never speaks parts. She never acts. Yet her average weekly wage is \$47.45 a week. The most successful man extra is Babe Green, 33 years old, who has been employed 445 days in two years and averages \$49.95 a week.

Plan Large Addition to Gurnee Viking Home

A \$40,000 addition to the Viking home in Gurnee was authorized at the fortieth convention of the order which closed last week at St. Charles. Construction on the addition is expected to be started in August.
