Women's Calisthenics Classes to Be Held at Roger Williams Beach

There has been some demand this year for women's classes in calisthenics at the beaches. In accordance with the park board policy to do everything possible for the benefit of people using the facilities, there will be a class started at the Roger Williams beach, under the direction of Ray Cox, guard at that beach, providing that there are enough showing interest to start a class of at least ten or fifteen. The classes will be limited to women, as there has been no call for that sort of thing for the men.

The classes will be held three times a week, Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, at 10:30 a. m. If those women interested will call the park board office, H. P. 2763, and leave their names and addresses, the classes will commence as soon as there is enough to warrant them.

During the past week the beaches have had as good an attendance as they have all season. The water has

warmed up considerably, and the bathing is safe for all. The three public beaches, Park, Central, and Roger Williams avenues, have been well populated every warm day, and as many as 250 people were at Central avenue at one time. Roger Williams avenue has also been used extensively.

It might be well for Highland Park people to remember to take with them to the beaches the beach cards which they have been asked to purchase for the use of the beaches all season. When they do not have them, there is a good deal of confusion caused to the guards who have to check up on the people. These cards are ten cents for people 12-16 years of age; 25 cents for those 16-21; and 50 cents for those of 21 or over. They may be purchased at the beaches or at the park board office.

Pond scums and sea weeds of various types present one of the interesting phases of botanical study, and a case illustrating the chief facts about them is on exhibition in the hall of plant life at Field Museum of Natural History.
