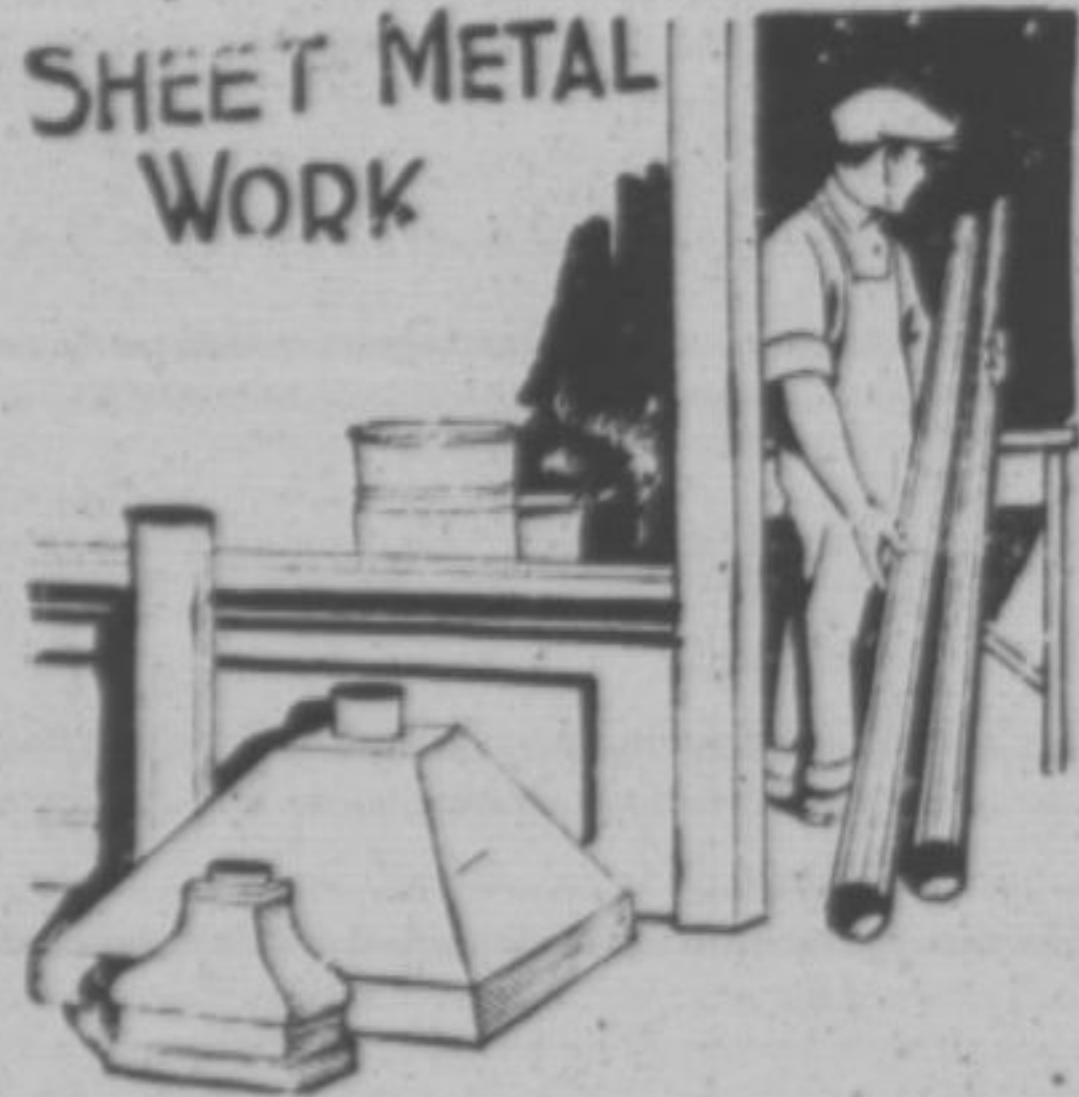

WORLD FAIR TO SHOW HISTORY OF MINING

All the Romance and Hardship of the Prospector to Be Demonstrated

All the romance and hardships of the mining industry, from the days of '49 to the present day prospector of Canada, who now travels in a few hours by airplane the distances into the wilderness that formerly took weeks, are to be shown as part of the geological exhibit at the Chicago World's Fair.

According to Professor E. S. Bastin, of the University of Chicago, chairman of the sub-committee on economic geology appointed for the fair by the National Research Council his committee plans to show in its exhibit every detail in the development of prospecting, from the days of the "Desert Rat" to the present "instrumental methods."

"We propose," said Dr. Bastin, "to show the contrast between the old timer, with his burrow and gold pan, and the Canadian prospector of today who is using airplanes instead of canoes and dog sleds to carry him over stretches of wilderness that formerly took weeks to cover. We also plan to show how airplane photography is being used to map the northland; to give us an idea of the trend and structure of the rocks, as well as geographic features."

Ore Exhibits

"In order to impress upon the visitors to the fair the importance of geology in their every day life, we may show them how large a quantity of ore—copper, iron, zinc, nickel, etc.—is necessary in making up each separate part of their automobile. This we may demonstrate by showing a finished automobile, then another one in separate parts before being assembled, with each part labeled and attached to its particular pile of ore by a luminous tube.

"We plan to show the public the various instrumental methods of prospecting and hope we shall be able to allow visitors to operate the modern magnetic dip needles and other instruments which science has given us.

"We want to show to visitors how, while in 1833 the world was largely dependent on agricultural resources, today we are living decidedly in the age of minerals.
