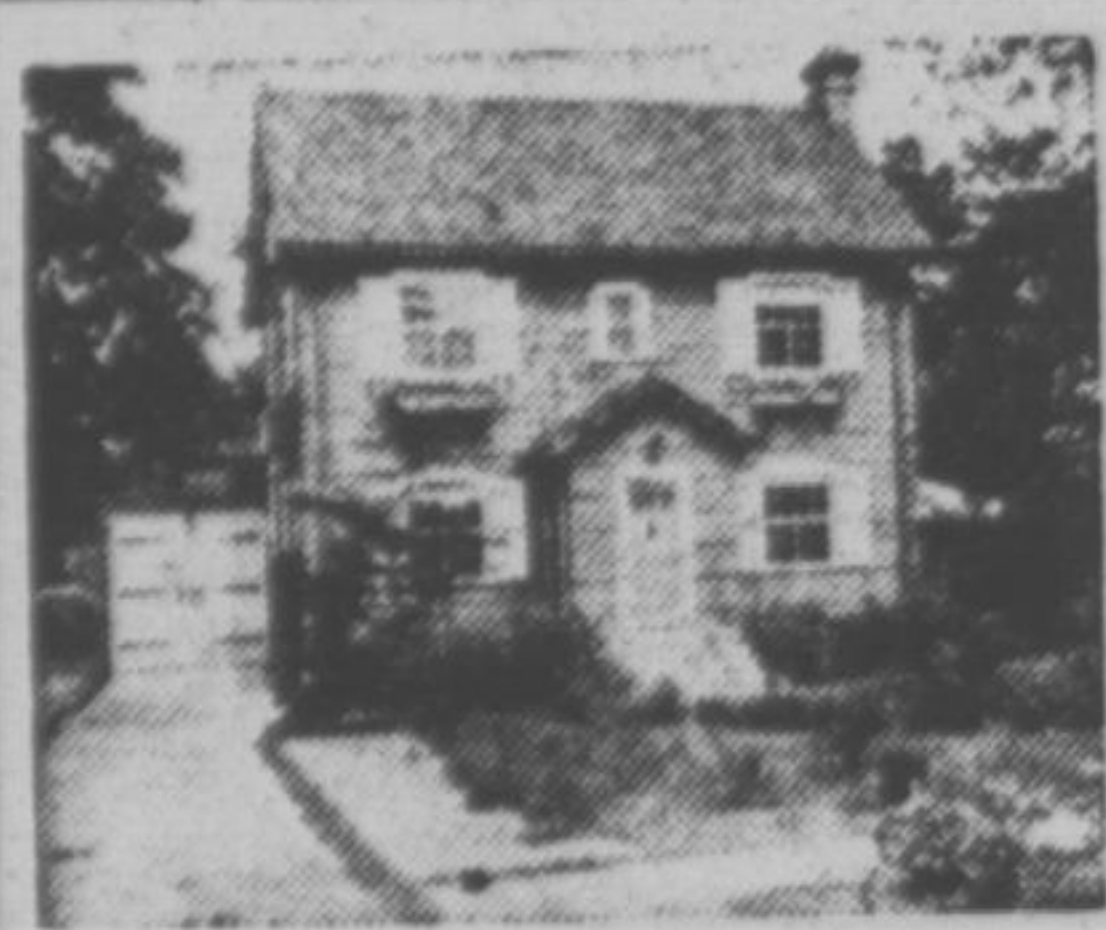


Outdoor Meeting Monday
