VOTE TO CONSOLIDATE SCHOOL DIST. 110-112

Special Election Called for Saturday Evening; Would Increase Assessed Valuation

A special election called by T. A. Simpson, county superintendent of schools, will be held Saturday evening, from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m., for the purpose of voting for or against the proposition of the consolidation of school district 112 with school district 110 (which is known as the Wilmot school).

Polling places include the Wilmot school for all voters residing in the village of Deerfield in school district 110, club house in Bannockburn for those residing in the village of Bannockburn in district 110 and 112; Clavey Ravinia Nurseries office for all those in district 110 and 112 outside the villages of Deerfield and Bannockburn.

The consolidation of these two districts will give an assessed valuation of about \$1,000,000 which would give a bonding power of approximately \$25,000 and if the proposition carries the original plans of the Wilmot school will be completed. This means a larger, better school with all modern educational advantages. A one or two room school would be erected in Bannockburn. At present property in school district 112 is not being taxed for school purposes and includes some very valuable estates.

The present board of directors for school district 110 are E. L. Vineyard, E. L. Clavey, and E. J. Ginter; for district 112 are Miles Conway, Lawrence O'Connor and Mrs. Hansen.

This is a very important issue and all voters in the districts should make a special effort to come out and vote.
