Romance Among Colonial Troops of Two Nations Is Pictured in "Mamba"

How did the officers of the British and German Colonial troops in Africa regard each other at the outbreak of the great war?

Far from the seat of actual combat, it was difficult for them to have the same feeling of enmity that existed in England and Germany proper and on the battle lines in France. In East Africa, where the possessions of the two powers bordered each other, cordial relations had for years existed between the British and German troops, and they spent much of their leisure time drinking together at the same canteens and attending the same social functions given by their respective army garrisons.

This cordiality was cemented even more firmly by the fact that each army group recognized a common enemy in the horde of black tribesmen who outnumbered their small white settlements more than ten to one.

These problems form the background of the story of "Mamba," a Tiffany all-talking feature done in technicolor and to be presented Friday and Saturday, July 11 and 12, at the Deerpath theatre.

The locale of "Mamba" is the little German settlement of New Posen in East Africa, only a few miles from the borders of the British possessions, in the year 1914. The richest man in all that territory is a degenerate German planter, August Bolte by name, who is despised and ignored by both Germans and English, and the name "Mamba," being that of a deadly snake of that part of the world, is symbolic of his character.

Around this man a tale of tense drama is woven. Bolte's beautiful wife, whom he has literally bought from an impoverished German Count, falls in love with the dashing young Major in command of the German garrison, who, incidentally, is the hero of the story. In a maniacal desire for revenge, Bolte incites an uprising of the black tribesmen at the time when news arrives of the beginning of hostilities between England and Germany in Europe. The German garrison, surrounded by savages, is saved from annihilation by the timely arrival of the British Colonial troops, once their staunch

friends, but now their enemies by reason of the declaration of war.

Jean Hersholt plays the role of Bolte, Eleanor Boardman is his wife and Ralph Forbes is the German Major. "Mamba," produced at a cost of more than half a million dollars, is said to be one of the most elaborate pictures ever filmed, and its African locale and the fact that it is in both dialogue and color make it one of the big pictures of 1930.
