

DISCUSSES ROUTE 42 CHANGES NORTHWARD

Waukegan Paper Reports Plans Under Way for Extension West of Tracks

The following from the Waukegan Times is another version of the proposed improvement and alteration of State Route 42, through Highland Park, Highwood and Lake Forest:

Abandonment of the road through Fort Sheridan and the routing of state highway route No. 42 north on Green Bay road from Highland Park to Lake Forest is being favored by chambers of commerce and other civic groups of north shore communities.

Despite the fact that an appropriation of 115,000 is being sought by the war department to provide for the repaving of the road through Fort Sheridan it is contended that the route of the road through the reservation is unsatisfactory. It is pointed out that during the summer months, as at present, the road is closed to the public because of army training camps.

Detour at Laurel Avenue

Under the plan which will probably be sponsored by the chambers of commerce and civic organizations of Highland Park, Highwood, Lake Forest and Lake Bluff, through traffic would be detoured from Sheridan (Continued on page 37)
