

### Names Committee to Explain to Public Tax Amendment Plan

Under the authority of the resolution passed by the house and senate, Governor Louis I. Emmerson has appointed five members of the committee of 15 whose duty is to prepare an explanation for the public of the proposed stall income tax amendment

that will be voted upon in November.

The five members appointed by Governor Emmerson are:

Harrison B. Riley, chairman of the board, Chicago Title and Trust company, Chicago; Victor A. Olander, secretary Illinois Federation of Labor, Chicago; Harry A. Wheeler, chairman of board, First National bank, Chicago; Sam H. Thompson, president American Farm Bureau Federation, Quincy; Theodore R. Gerlach, president Gerlach, Barklow

Manufacturing company, Joliet.

The committee of five house members appointed by Speaker David E. Shanahan are:

Rep. David Hunter, Jr., Rockford; William G. Thon, Chicago; C. A. Bruer, Pontiac; Alexander Wilson, Cairo; John P. Devine, Dixon.

The remaining five of the committee of fifteen are to be appointed from the members of the senate by Lieutenant Governor Fred E. Sterling.

### JUDGE CANDIDATE, PLAN OF DEMOCRATS

#### May Run Man for Circuit Court Bench This Fall in Lake Co.; Prospects

For the first time in 24 years the Lake County Democratic party will have a candidate for circuit court judge, it is reported.

While in the past elections the Republicans have had clear sailing with the judicial post, this year the Democrats have decided to enter the field. The growth of the Democratic party in the county in the past eight years has brought about an optimism that the united organization will make a strong showing at the coming fall election.

"Hoover got only a two to one victory over Smith at the last presidential election in this county," John O'Keefe of Highland Park, chairman of the county Democratic party, stated when interviewed by a Waukegan newspaper, "as compared to the Coolidge nine to one vote over Cox."

#### To Decide Soon

Mr. O'Keefe said that the candidate for circuit court judge would be decided on at the Democratic Central Committee meeting to be held within a few days. At this time he stated he was not in a position to name the selection.

Clarence W. Diver, president of the Lake County Bar association and head of the Waukegan Board of Education and the board of trustees of Lake Forest university, has been suggested by Democrats. Whether Mr. Diver will accept the candidacy for circuit court judge has not been ascertained.

"We will have a full slate at the election this year," Mr. O'Keefe said.

This means that half of the Board of Supervisors whose terms expire this year will, in all probability, be up against candidates from the opposing party.

#### Terms Expiring

The supervisors whose terms expire this year are: William A. Rosing of Antioch, Edward A. Brown of Avon, Bert C. Thompson of Benton, Hans M. Dronen of Benton, William J. Obee of Deerfield, Charles I. Harbaugh of Deerfield, William E. Bletsch of Deerfield, H. C. W. Meyer of Fremont, W. E. Miller of Libertyville, David Van Patten of Newport, W. G. Dickinson of Shields, Edward J. Monahan of Shields, Edward M. Mawman of Shields, and Fred Decker, John F. McCann, Dan Short, M. P. Dilger, W. C. Berry and D. A. Hutton of Waukegan.

It is likely, if the official 1930 census is recognized as a population basis at the coming election, there will be offices for at least six new assistant supervisors in the county including five from Waukegan alone.

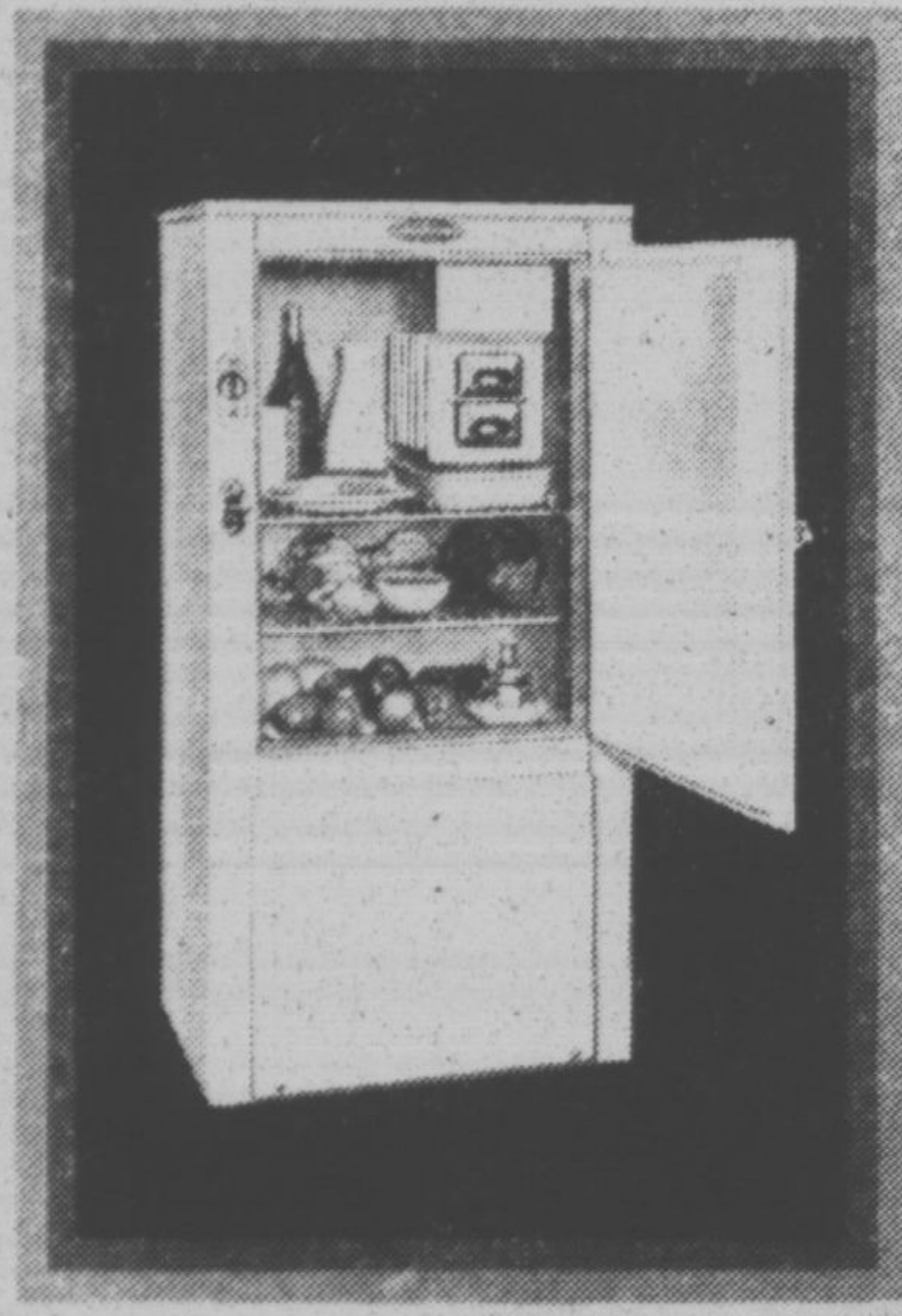
