

### BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY

#### Interesting Happenings About This Part of North Shore; County Seat

There is a chance that Waukegan will get \$75,000 for a fish cultural station under terms of a bill passed by the Congress which has just ended its session. Waukegan is being seriously considered for the plant.

The estate of Edgar B. Yager, Waukegan, was shown to be \$40,117 in county court when Judge P. L. Persons set the inheritance tax at \$402.35. The widow, Jennie, was left the entire estate.

Plans for the construction of an American Legion building on park property was given the approval of the Waukegan Park board at their meeting last week, subject to the approval of the board's attorney.

Dr. and Mrs. John L. Taylor of Libertyville have returned to their home after a 10 day motor trip through the eastern part of the United States. Dr. Taylor resumed his duties as county coroner immediately relieving Dr. Maurice J. Penny, acting coroner.

The public library of North Chicago has a total of 5,443 volumes, according to the annual report of the library board submitted to the city council at its meeting last week.

Frank P. Worack, collector of internal revenue, collected the sum of \$2,865 in taxes from delinquent income taxpayers in Waukegan and Lake county during the month of June. Mr. Worack stated that few delinquents have escaped payment of the penalty.

Burglars, believed to be members of the same gang which held up and robbed Eugene Cox, Antioch road house owner, of \$116 and a gold watch, escaping after a gun battle with deputy sheriffs later entered the roadhouse of Einer Sorenson, Antioch, forced open the cash register and looted it of \$25.

County Judge Perry L. Persons, Mrs. Mary Polmateer Funk, Mr. and Mrs. Philo Burgess and Frank Burke, chairman of the detention home of the board, were named by the Board of Supervisors to represent Lake county at the State Welfare Convention to be held next November at Springfield.

#### H. P. Artist to Have Exhibit at Institute

A group of "one man shows" will be opened at the Chicago Art Institute July 24. Among them will be painting by Jean Crawford Adams, a Chicago painter who has been exhibiting in New York. Her work is modernistic. Rudolph Ingerle, of Highland Park will be another exhibitor. Mr. Ingerle, with John A. Spellman of Oak Park, discovered the fine painting grounds in the Great Smokey Mountains in Eastern Tennessee. With the exception of a few done in the Ozarks, Mr. Ingerle's paintings will be landscapes in the Smoky range.

#### Arrest Believed to Solve Cattle Thefts

Arrest of Carl Green, his wife, Silvia and Douglas Orr, on a farm in Kane county near the Lake county line recently will, it is believed, result in the solving of wholesale thefts of cattle in Lake county as well as in Kane, DuPage and McHenry counties.

Thefts of cattle in Lake county became so numerous that farmers in the southwestern part of the county have organized a vigilance society and raised the sum of \$500 as a reward for the arrest and conviction of the rustlers.

Arrest of the three resulted from an investigation started by Sheriff C. T. Carlson of Kendall county.

The three were taken to Yorkville and later turned over to Deputy Sheriff Jones of Kane county. Mr. Jones said today that there had been no checkup on the cattle lost by Kane county farmers, but that as soon as all who had lost beeves or milk cows recently reported, a list would be ready.

Nine cows were found at the farm, all of which the authorities believe had been stolen and transported in a truck driven by Mrs. Green.

#### Retiring Legislator Honored by Colleagues

At the close of the special session of the state legislature, Hon. M. P. Rice of Fulton county, was the recipient of a beautiful watch and chain, the gift of his Democratic colleagues, as a token of the esteem in which he is held. 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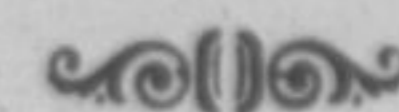
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
