# Proposing Municipal Power Plant, Waukegan

Proposals that Waukegan erect a municipal power plant to supply current to the water works and to the street lighting system, were introduced into the city council last week as a tentative suggestion by Commissioner A. F. Carney. No action on the proposals was asked by the commissioner and none was taken by the council.

In introducing the matter, the commissioner pointed out the fact that Diesel engines could be installed in the old pumping plant at the foot of Madison street at a cost of from \$35,-000 to \$40,000. These engines would be sufficient to supply power to the filtration plant and the street lights at a saving of approximately \$25,000 a year.


