Seventh Week

The seventh week of Ravinia Opera will begin Sunday, August 3. For several weeks past international concerts have been the Sunday afternoon attraction at Ravinia, and there are still several more of these to be given before the season reaches its end on the first Sunday of September, but the national series will be interrupted on Sunday, August 3, to give many members of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra an opportunity to appear individually and to demonstrate the possibilities of their favorite instruments for solo work.

The concert will be called "An Afternoon of Solo Numbers by Members of the Orchestra" and the solo part of the program will be presented by Ernest Liegel, flute; Robert Lindemann, clarinet; Edward Llewellyn, trumpet; Marcel Honore, horn; John Weicher, violin; Joseph Vito, harp. Pellegrino Leece, horn; Carl Bruckner, Cello; Hugo Fox, bassoon; Clarence Evans, viola; Francesco Napolilli, English horn; Edward Geffert, trombone. The orchestra, under the direction of Eric DeLamarter will play the "Euranthe" overture by Weber, and Rimsky-Korsakoff's "Spanish Caprice" in which the percussion section will be featured. There will be no charge for seats at this concert, the general admission at the gate covering everything.
