Frank Sack, Victim of Blood Poisoning

Death claimed one of Deerfield's pioneer residents when Frank C. Sack succumbed in the Highland Park hospital at 5:30 o'clock Saturday evening, July 26.

Blood poisoning resulting from a splinter of a chicken bone, which lodged in his finger about two weeks ago was the ultimate cause of Mr. Sack's demise.

Mr. Sack spent all his life time on a farm on Telegraph road, now known as Waukegan road in Deerfield where he was born in 1866.

On Nov. 12, 1898 he married Minnie Tioch, of Germany and to this union were born four children, Frank Jr., William, John Sach and Lillian Anderson.

Funeral services were held from the late home on Tuesday, July 29 at 2 o'clock and at St. Paul's Evangelical church at 2:30 with the pastor, Rev. F. G. Piepenbrok officiating.

Burial was in North Shore cemetery.

Mr. Sack leaves to mourn his death, his wife, four children, three grand children, four sisters Mrs. Levi Schinleber of Northbrook, Mrs. Annie Kuhn of Highland Park, Mrs. Katie Boch of Alburnette, Iowa; Mrs. Mary Selig of Alpha, Iowa, and one brother Charles Sach of Highland Park.

Flying Circus at Sky Harbor Airport Sunday, August 3rd

Freddie Lund's famous Flying Circus will appear at Sky Harbor airport, on Dundee road, west of Waukegan road, on Sunday afternoon and evening, August 3. Lund was the first man to make an outside loop in a commercial plane, and has been an outstanding stunt pilot for the last five years. He does the outside loop, flying upside-down turns, slow and snap rolls, vertical spirals and every known form of sky acrobatics. Also Betty Lund, noted woman licensed pilot will perform on this date.

The only glider of its kind will give an exhibition of its famous powerless loops. This glider holds the world's record for 12 consecutive loops. Lyman Voelpel, pilot of the glider, and Capt. Frank Hawks, are the only two glider pilots in U. S. having permission from the government for towing gliders behind airplanes. An attempt also will be made with this glider to make a spin without crashing. The attempt will be made from about a mile altitude to give pilot chance to "bail out" in a parachute if the glider can not be righted. A parachute jump also will be a feature of the program.

Huge tri-motored Ford planes and numerous other ships will be available for carrying passengers over the north shore.
