> The only glider of its kind will give an exhibition of its famous powerless loops. This glider holds the world's record for 12 consecutive loops.- Lyman Voelpel, pilot of the glider, and Capt. Frank Hawks, are the only two glider pilots in U. S. ment for towing gliders behind airplanes. An attempt also will be made with this glider to make a spin without crashing. The attempt will be made from about a mile altitude to give pilot chance to "bail out" in a parachute if the glider can not be righted. A parachute jump also will be a feature of the program.
